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Fiscal note status: The fiscal note reflects the introduced bill, which was recommended by the Executive Committee of the Legislative Council.

Summary Information

Overview. The bill allows the Executive Committee of the Legislative Council to adopt policies for the remote participation of legislators in joint committees held at any time of the year.

Types of impacts. The bill is projected to affect the following areas on an ongoing basis:

Summary of Legislation

Under current law, the Executive Committee of the Legislative Council may adopt policies allowing legislators to remotely participate in interim committee meetings, and in legislative proceedings during a disaster emergency. The bill expands the executive committee's authority to adopt policies allowing remote participation by legislators in meetings of any joint committees that are comprised of members from both chambers, and are held at any time of the year.

State Expenditures

The bill minimally increases workload for Legislative Council Staff's Information Technology staff to manage remote participation at additional committee hearings throughout the year. This increase in workload does not require a change in appropriations.

Effective Date

The bill takes effect upon signature of the Governor, or upon becoming law without his signature.
