The bill creates a grant program to help public schools obtain medical assistance during the pandemic emergency. The bill increases state expenditures in FY 2020-21 only.

Summary:** For FY 2020-21, the bill requires an appropriation of \$1.0 million to the Colorado Department of Education.**Fiscal Note  
Status:** The fiscal note reflects the introduced bill. This bill was not enacted into law; therefore, the impacts identified in this analysis do not take effect.

## **Summary of Legislation**

The bill creates a program in the Colorado Department of Education (CDE) to award noncompetitive grants to local education providers (LEPs) to temporarily employ a physician during the COVID-19 emergency. LEPs may contract with a physician to provide medical advice and health assessments, and to act as a liaison with state and local health agencies. In the current FY 2020-21, the bill requires that the General Assembly appropriate \$1.0 million for the program.

LEPs may request up to \$50,000 to contract with a physician. The contract must expire within 30 days following the end of the governor's disaster emergency executive order. CDE must award grants to LEPs in the order in which requests are received, except that the department may prioritize requests from LEPs in areas experiencing a high number of COVID-19 infections or that are managing significant exposure and quarantine protocols for students and staff. The bill is repealed July 1, 2023.

## **State Expenditures**

In FY 2020-21, the bill increases state expenditures in the CDE by \$1.0 million. After administrative expenses, the program may award about \$990,000 in grant assistance to LEPs. Administrative expenses are estimated at 0.1 FTE to implement the program in FY 2020-21 only.

## **School District**

School district revenue and expenditures increase for districts that apply for and receive a grant.

## **Effective Date**

The bill was postponed indefinitely by the House Committee on Public Health Care and Human Services on November 30, 2020.

**State Appropriations**

In the current FY 2020-21, the bill requires a General Fund appropriation of \$1.0 million to the Colorado Department of Education, and 0.1 FTE.
