CONCERNING A SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION TO THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

SECTION 1. Appropriation to the department of education for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2017. In Session Laws of Colorado 2017, section 2 of chapter 421, (SB 17-254), amend Part III as follows:
