CONCERNING RECOGNITION OF SINGLE PARENT DAY IN COLORADO.


WHEREAS, The dedication and achievements of single parents deserve respect and recognition; and

WHEREAS, In 1984, then-President Ronald Reagan declared March 21 as "National Single Parent Day"; now, therefore,


Be It Resolved by the Senate of the Seventy-fourth General Assembly of the State of Colorado:
