After consideration on the merits, the Committee recommends the following:

<u>HB24-1444</u> be amended as follows, and as so amended, be referred to the Committee on <u>Appropriations</u> with favorable recommendation:

1 Amend printed bill, page 2, after line 1 insert:

2 "SECTION 1. Legislative declaration. (1) The general
3 assembly finds and declares that:

4 (a) Beginning with the federal "Indian Civilization Act" enacted 5 in 1819, the United States enacted laws and implemented policies 6 establishing and supporting federal Indian boarding schools across the 7 nation. The purpose of federal Indian boarding schools was to culturally 8 assimilate American Indian children by forcibly relocating them from 9 their families and communities to distant residential facilities to suppress 10 the children's identities, language, and beliefs. For over one hundred fifty 11 vears, hundreds of thousands of American Indian children were taken 12 from their communities. Over three hundred fifty federal Indian boarding 13 schools existed in the United States. By 1926, nearly eighty-three percent 14 of all American Indian children of school age were in boarding schools.

15 (b) The impact of the boarding schools on American Indian 16 families has been immeasurable. Families lost their traditional language, 17 parenting authority, and the ability to pass on American Indian culture 18 and traditions. The trauma from Indian boarding schools crosses 19 generational boundaries and the boarding school policy resulted in 20 long-standing intergenerational trauma, cycles of violence and abuse, 21 disappearance of American Indian people, premature deaths, mental 22 health disorders, and substance abuse in American Indian communities.

(c) In Colorado, there were at least seven federal Indian boarding
schools, including: the Teller Indian school in Grand Junction, the
Southern Ute boarding school in Ignacio, a boarding school in Towaoc
operated by the federal bureau of Indian affairs, and the original Fort
Lewis Indian school in Hesperus, Colorado;

1 (d) In order to heal from the generational trauma, we must 2 confront the past and shed light on the hidden cruelty;

3 (e) It is the intent of the general assembly to build on the first
4 report of the "Federal Indian Boarding Schools in Colorado: 1880-1990",
5 completed by History Colorado;

6 (f) There are sill outstanding archival and physical research 7 questions to be answered about boarding schools in Colorado;

8 (g) Tribal representations noted that the work must include the 9 voices of American Indian peoples who are impacted, which will be 10 served by the oral history work; and

(h) The tribal consultations during the fiscal year 2023 were focused on research updates, and there should be additional tribal consultations with thirty-three tribal nations and listening sessions with American Indian and Alaska Native communities in urban communities to address and plan for a number of key topics including care and memorialization at sites, support for impacted communities, and education for impacted communities and Colorado in general.".

MUST GIVE PREFERENCE TO A THIRD-PARTY ENTITY THAT CONSISTS OF
INDIVIDUALS WHO ARE OF AMERICAN INDIAN DESCENT OR ARE
HISTORICALLY IMPACTED AMERICAN INDIANS.

(5) (a) THERE IS ESTABLISHED AN AMERICAN INDIAN STEERING
COMMITTEE IN THE SOCIETY. THE STEERING COMMITTEE'S PURPOSE IS TO
IDENTIFY AND ADVISE THE SOCIETY ON AREAS OF CONCERN REGARDING
INDIAN BOARDING SCHOOLS AND ISSUES RELATING TO ORGANIZING OR
CONDUCTING SEARCH EFFORTS RELATED TO GRAVES AT SCHOOL SITES,
DEVELOPMENT OF SUPPORT GROUPS, OR OTHER SUPPORTIVE EFFORTS

RELATED TO INDIAN BOARDING SCHOOLS. THE STEERING COMMITTEE
 SHALL MEET AT LEAST ONCE PER QUARTER IN STATE FISCAL YEAR 2024-25,
 AND BIANNUALLY THEREAFTER, AT DATES AND TIMES REQUESTED BY THE
 COMMISSION. THE STEERING COMMITTEE MAY MEET ELECTRONICALLY.
 (b) THE STEERING COMMITTEE CONSISTS OF THE FOLLOWING

5 (b) THE STEERING COMMITTEE CONSISTS OF THE FOLLOWING
6 MEMBERS, WHO MUST BE APPOINTED BY THE SOCIETY WITH INCLUSIVE
7 REPRESENTATION FROM ORGANIZATIONS THAT ARE LED BY AND SERVE
8 AMERICAN INDIAN COMMUNITIES IN COLORADO:

9 (I) AN INDIVIDUAL WHO REPRESENTS THE UTE MOUNTAIN UTE 10 TRIBE AND WHO IS CONFIRMED BY THE UTE MOUNTAIN UTE TRIBAL 11 COUNCIL;

(II) AN INDIVIDUAL WHO REPRESENTS THE SOUTHERN UTE INDIAN
 TRIBE AND WHO IS CONFIRMED BY THE SOUTHERN UTE TRIBAL COUNCIL;

14 (III) TWO INDIVIDUALS WHO ARE CITIZENS OF OTHER TRIBAL
15 NATIONS IDENTIFIED AS HAVING MEMBERS ENROLLED AT ANY TIME IN AN
16 INDIAN BOARDING SCHOOL IN COLORADO;

17 (IV) THREE SURVIVORS OF INDIAN BOARDING SCHOOLS IN18 COLORADO;

19 (V) THREE DESCENDANTS OF COLORADO INDIAN BOARDING20 SCHOOL SURVIVORS;

(VI) ONE AMERICAN INDIAN IN THE CULTURAL RESOURCEMANAGEMENT PROFESSION;

(VII) ONE TRAUMA-INFORMED MENTAL HEALTH PROFESSIONAL;

(VIII) ONE AMERICAN INDIAN EMPLOYEE OF THE SOCIETY;

(IX) ONE INDIVIDUAL WHO HAS EXPERTISE IN RESEARCHING THE
HISTORY AND IMPACT OF INDIAN BOARDING SCHOOLS; AND

27 (X) ONE TRIBAL HISTORIC PRESERVATION OFFICER FROM ANY OF
28 THE IDENTIFIED TRIBAL NATIONS THAT HAD STUDENTS ATTEND A
29 BOARDING SCHOOL IN COLORADO.

30 (c) THE SOCIETY SHALL APPOINT MEMBERS OF THE STEERING
31 COMMITTEE AS SOON AS PRACTICABLE AFTER THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS
32 SECTION, BUT NO LATER THAN SEPTEMBER 1, 2024.

33 (d) THE STEERING COMMITTEE MEMBERS SERVE WITHOUT
34 COMPENSATION AND WITHOUT REIMBURSEMENT FOR ANY EXPENSES
35 INCURRED RELATED TO SERVING ON THE COMMITTEE.".
