# Supplemental Budget Requests FY 2024-25

## Department of Transportation

JBC Working Document - Subject to Change Staff Recommendation Does Not Represent Committee Decision

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#### Overview of Department

The Colorado Department of Transportation (CDOT) is responsible for the construction, maintenance, and operation of Colorado's state highway system with additional responsibilities relating to aviation, transit, rail, and other modes of transportation. It acts under the policy direction of the eleven-member Transportation Commission.

CDOT's Long Bill is an estimate of the amount of revenue that it expects to receive in the fiscal year and a reflection of how that revenue will be broadly allocated for future use. Approximately 95 percent of CDOT's annual revenue is continuously appropriated by statutory provisions and controlled by the Transportation Commission or another CDOT board. The Department typically does not receive General Fund appropriations, but it does receive periodic transfers from the General Fund and other sources.

#### FY 2024-25 Description of Incremental Changes

**Statewide common policy supplemental requests:** The request includes net-zero adjustments for non-prioritized requests associated with statewide common policy requests. The changes are associated with adjustments to the Department's payments for state property risk

management and to the Office of Information technology (OIT), which are determined through common policies. For CDOT, any changes in administrative spending are offset by equal reductions in the Department's Construction, Maintenance, and Operations line item. The prioritized versions of these requests will be presented during the supplemental presentations for the Department of Personnel (state property) and Office of the Governor (OIT). The recommendation is pending Committee action on common policy supplementals.
