A BILL FOR AN ACT 101 CONCERNING A REQUIREMENT THAT AN ELECTOR ESTABLISH 102 IDENTIFICATION FOR VOTING PURPOSES BY SHOWING A 103 GOVERNMENT-ISSUED FORM OF IDENTIFICATION THAT SHOWS A 104 PHOTOGRAPH OF THE ELIGIBLE ELECTOR, AND, IN CONNECTION 105 THEREWITH, MAKING AN APPROPRIATION.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. Section 1 of the bill removes from the list of forms of documentation used for establishing identification for purposes of the "Uniform Election Code of 1992" (code):

- ! A copy of a current utility bill, bank statement, government check, paycheck, or other government document that shows the name and address of the elector:
- ! A valid medicare or medicaid card issued by the United States health care financing administration;
- ! A certified copy of a birth certificate for the elector issued in the United States; or
- ! Certified documentation of naturalization.

Section 1 of the bill also allows a valid identification card issued by a nationally recognized tribal government to constitute identification for voting purposes if the identification contains a photograph of the eligible elector.

Section 2 of the bill specifies that, in connection with any provision of the code requiring an elector to submit identification as a condition of casting a ballot, state law prohibits the department of revenue from charging certain applicants a fee for a state-issued identification card.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:
