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**A BILL FOR AN ACT**

101 **CONCERNING A STUDY OF THE DELEGATION OF FUNCTIONS OF CERTAIN**  
102 **REGULATIONS RELATED TO MOTOR VEHICLES ADMINISTERED BY**  
103 **THE DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE.**

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**Bill Summary**

The bill requires the department of revenue to study and make recommendations concerning the delegation of driver's license issuance, motor vehicle registration, and certificate of title issuance to private entities. Standards are set for the study. The department is required to make the report and recommendations to the transportation legislation

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1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

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3 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, add 42-1-232 as  
4 follows:

5 **42-1-232. Kiosk pilot program.** (1) THE DEPARTMENT MAY  
6 CONDUCT A KIOSK PILOT PROGRAM USING A PRIVATE PROVIDER OF MOTOR  
7 VEHICLE SERVICES USING THE DEPARTMENT OFFICE OR THE OFFICES OF AN  
8 AUTHORIZED AGENT.

9 (2) THE DEPARTMENT MAY ASSESS A CONVENIENCE FEE, NOT TO  
10 EXCEED THREE DOLLARS, FOR THE SERVICES PROVIDED IN THE KIOSK PILOT  
11 PROGRAM. THE DEPARTMENT MAY AUTHORIZE THE AUTHORIZED AGENT  
12 OR THE PRIVATE PROVIDER TO RETAIN A PORTION OF THE SERVICE FEE.

13 (3) THE DEPARTMENT MAY ACCEPT FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE FROM  
14 AN AUTHORIZED AGENT OR A PRIVATE PARTY TO IMPLEMENT THIS  
15 PROGRAM, SO LONG AS THE FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE IS DIRECTLY RELATED  
16 TO THE KIOSK PILOT PROGRAM AND DOES NOT STIPULATE A CONDITION  
17 THAT CONFLICTS WITH STATE LAW.

18 (4) ANY PRIVATE PROVIDER PARTICIPATING IN THE KIOSK PILOT  
19 PROGRAM IS NOT EXCLUDED FROM ANY COMPETITIVE BID PROCESS ARISING  
20 FROM LEGISLATION PASSED OR RULES PROMULGATED ON ACCOUNT OF THE  
21 STUDY DONE UNDER SECTION 42-1-231, C.R.S.

22 **SECTION 2.** **No appropriation.** The general assembly has  
23 determined that this act can be implemented within existing  
24 appropriations, and therefore no separate appropriation of state money is  
25 necessary to carry out the purposes of this act.

1           **SECTION 3. Act subject to petition - effective date.** This act  
2 takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the  
3 ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August  
4 10, 2016, if adjournment sine die is on May 11, 2016); except that, if a  
5 referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the  
6 state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act  
7 within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect  
8 unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in  
9 November 2016 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the  
10 official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
