101 **MEMORIALIZING FORMER REPRESENTATIVE JOHN ROBERT**
102 **MCELDERRY.**

1 WHEREAS, Our respected former colleague, John Robert
2 McElderry, a past member of the Colorado House of Representatives,
3 departed this life on March 30, 2015; and

4 WHEREAS, Representative McElderry was born in Cleveland,
5 Ohio, on February 7, 1928, before moving to Pullman, Washington, and
6 then Santa Ana, California; and

7 WHEREAS, Representative McElderry finished high school early
8 and enlisted in the United States Air Force; and

9 WHEREAS, In 1951, Representative McElderry graduated from
10 the University of Southern California (USC) as a 2nd Lieutenant in the
11 United States Air Force Reserves with a Bachelor's Degree in Public
12 Administration; and

13 WHEREAS, While studying at USC, Representative McElderry
14 married his life partner Joanne, and they eventually had three children;

2 WHEREAS, Representative McElderry served in the Air Force
3 until 1953, when he returned to Cleveland, Ohio, to work at the
4 Connecticut General Life Insurance Company; and

5 WHEREAS, Representative McElderry eventually felt called to the
6 ministry, and attended the Union Theological Seminary in New York
7 City, where he received a Bachelor of Divinity in 1963 and a Master of
8 Sacred Theology in 1968; and

9 WHEREAS, After serving as Pastor of Bethany Congregational
10 Church in East Rockaway, New York, Representative McElderry moved
11 his family to Colorado to serve as Pastor of Wheat Ridge Congregational
12 Church; and

13 WHEREAS, Representative McElderry's love of country and
14 lifelong commitment to the Republican Party led him to serve in the
15 Colorado State Legislature for two terms, from 1977 to 1980; and

16 WHEREAS, During that time, he served on the Appropriations
17 Committee, as Vice-chair of the Education and Finance Committees, and
18 as Chair of the Rules Committee; and

19 WHEREAS, He also served on a number of interim committees,
20 including the Fire and Police Pensions and Higher Education Interim
21 Committees in 1977 and 1978; and

22 WHEREAS, After his time in the legislature, in 1981
23 Representative McElderry went on to serve as Regional Chief of the
24 United States Department of Health and Human Services; and

25 WHEREAS, Representative McElderry loved nature, and often
26 took his family on car-camping trips through national parks in Iowa and
27 California, and also went backpacking in Colorado; and

28 WHEREAS, Representative McElderry cherished his family and
29 friends and loved reading, listening to music and the news, talking
30 politics, creating gardens with his wife, and hosting family gatherings;
31 and

32 WHEREAS, His legacy is one of service to God, his family, his

1 country, and an eternal optimism that he shared with all; now, therefore,

2 *Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the Seventieth*
3 *General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

4 That, in the death of John Robert McElderry, the people of the
5 State of Colorado have lost a dedicated public servant and outstanding
6 citizen, and that we, the members of the House of Representatives of the
7 Seventieth General Assembly, do hereby extend our deep and heartfelt
8 sympathy to the members of his family and pay tribute to a man who
9 served his state well and faithfully.
