101 MEMORIALIZING FORMER REPRESENTATIVE DIANE HOPPE.

- WHEREAS, Diane Hoppe, the former Representative, departed
 this life on February 27, 2016, at the age of 68; and
- WHEREAS, Diane Hoppe was born on December 14, 1947, in
 Sterling, Colorado, to Dr. Thurmond and Mrs. Phyllis Rogers; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Diane Hoppe graduated from Sterling High School
 6 in 1965 and from the University of Colorado in Boulder in 1972 with a
 7 degree in microbiology; and
- 8 WHEREAS, After marrying, she and her husband worked on the 9 Hoppe farm and ranch near Sterling for 10 years and had two wonderful 10 sons, Dan and John; and
- WHEREAS, In 1985, Diane Hoppe moved back to Sterling and
 began working as the "ears" for Congressman Hank Brown in his
 Northeastern Colorado district; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Diane Hoppe served as director of the Lower South

1 Platte Water Conservancy District from 1997 to 1999; and

WHEREAS, In 1999, Diane Hoppe was appointed to replace
Representative Don Ament in House district 65 and served eight years in
the Colorado House of Representatives; and

5 WHEREAS, As a member of the House of Representatives, 6 Representative Hoppe's primary focus was water and agriculture and she 7 served on the Agriculture, Livestock, and Natural Resources committee 8 during all eight of her years in the House, becoming the first woman to 9 chair that committee, which she did for four years, as well as serving as 10 the House Minority Whip in 2005; and

- WHEREAS, Representative Hoppe also served on joint and
 statutory water committees during each interim, including the Special
 Water Committee, the Water Resources Legislation Review Committee,
 and the Water Resources Review Committee, serving as chair of those
 committees five times; and
- WHEREAS, In 2001, Representative Hoppe, recognizing the need
 to monitor Colorado's water resources on a continual and annual basis,
 sponsored the bill that created the Water Resources Legislation Review
 Committee, which became the Water Resources Review Committee in
 2002; and
- WHEREAS, Representative Hoppe sponsored numerous
 water-related bills, and her leadership helped to develop substitute water
 supply plans and add the Commissioner of Agriculture as a member of
 the Colorado Water Conservation Board; and
- WHEREAS, Representative Hoppe was a founding member of the
 Colorado Foundation for Water Education and served as its president
 from 2002 to 2007; and
- WHEREAS, After her final term in the House of Representatives
 ended in 2006, Representative Hoppe went on to serve on the South Platte
 Basin Roundtable and on the Colorado Water Conservation Board from
 2012 to 2016, serving as chair from 2015-2016; and
- WHEREAS, As a respected water leader, Representative Hoppe
 received numerous awards, including the Colorado Water Congress
 Wayne N. Aspinall Award for Outstanding Water Leader of the Year,

which is given not for a single achievement in a person's life, but for a
 career of service and contribution to the water community; and

WHEREAS, Representative Hoppe also received the 2012 President's award from the Colorado Foundation for Water Education, the Colorado Farm Bureau Service to Agriculture award, the Colorado Cattlemen Association Honorary Life Member award, and the Colorado Water Congress Honorary Life Member award and was named a "Top Ten Legislator" by the Colorado Association of Commerce and Industry; now, therefore,

Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the Seventieth
General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

12 That, in the death of Diane Hoppe, the people of the State of 13 Colorado have lost a devoted public servant and an outstanding citizen, 14 and that we, the members of the Seventieth General Assembly, pay tribute 15 to Diane Hoppe for her years of dedicated public service and do hereby 16 extend our deep and heartfelt sympathy to the members of her family.

Be It Further Resolved, That a copy of the Memorial be sent to her
sons Dan Hoppe and John Hoppe, both of Broomfield, and to her brother
John Rogers of Pocatello, Idaho.
