**BILL TOPIC:** IMMUNIZATION RECORDS FOR TEMPORARY CHILD CARE

**Summary of Legislation**

This bill specifies that a licensed child care center is not required to obtain immunization records for any enrolled child that attends the center on a short-term basis which is defined as up to fifteen days and no more than twice per year with at least 60 days between 15-consecutive-day periods. A child care center that chooses to accept children on a short-term basis must notify all of the parents that have children in the center that the center allows children to attend on a short-term basis without providing proof of immunization.

**State Expenditures**

For the current FY 2015-16 and FY 2016-17, this bill increases workload in the Department of Human Services to make rule changes, inform child care providers of the changes, and provide training to licensing staff. This workload is expected to be minimal and can be accomplished within existing appropriations.

**Effective Date**

The bill takes effect upon signature of the Governor, or upon becoming law without his signature.
