Summary of Legislation

This bill requires the Marijuana Enforcement Division (MED) in the Department of Revenue (DOR) to promulgate rules that prohibit the production and sale of edible medical marijuana-infused and retail marijuana products shaped like a human, animal, or fruit. The rules will take effect on October 1, 2017.

State Expenditures

This bill will minimally increase workload for the MED to promulgate rules, which the fiscal note assumes will occur in FY 2016-17. The MED is appropriated funds to make and enforce rules as part of its regulatory oversight of medical and retail marijuana. As such, the rulemaking and enforcement required under this bill can be accomplished within existing appropriations.

Effective Date

The bill was signed into law by the Governor and took effect on June 10, 2016.
