Summary of Legislation

The bill designates a yearly "Public Lands Day" on the third Saturday of May and allows appropriate observance by the public and public schools in the state. The bill requires the Governor to issue a yearly proclamation calling for the celebration of Public Lands Day.

State Expenditures

The bill may increase state expenditures by a minimal amount. A spike in the number of people seeking to volunteer in state parks on Public Lands Day may increase cash fund expenditures for the Department of Natural Resources (DNR), which incurs certain costs in accommodating volunteers. Any increase is expected to be minimal, however, and can be accomplished within existing appropriations.

Effective Date

The bill was signed into law by the Governor on May 17, 2016, and takes effect August 10, 2016, assuming no referendum petition is filed.
