NOTE: This bill was not enacted into law; therefore, the impacts identified in this analysis do not take effect.

Summary of Legislation

This bill modifies state academic standards for kindergarten through twelfth grade public education (K12). Under current law, the State Board of Education (SBE) is required to revise and re-adopt academic content standards by July 1, 2018, and every six years thereafter. This bill requires that, when revising and re-adopting the standards, the board include standards for the knowledge and skills necessary to understand the financing of higher education or other career-related postsecondary education, and for retirement planning.

The bill also encourages school districts to adopt math curriculum that includes resources to help students manage student loan debt and retirement planning.

State Expenditures

The bill will require that the academic content standards for financial literacy be expanded when the SBE revises and re-adopts standards during FY 2017-18. During that process, the Colorado Department of Education (CDE) will facilitate stakeholder meetings, provide staff support to the standards development committees, and oversee translation of printed materials and family guides. These activities will occur under current law, and the minimal increase in workload to include the bill's required subjects into the standards revisions does not require additional appropriations.

Effective Date

The bill was postponed indefinitely by the Senate Education Committee on February 11, 2016.
