**Summary of Legislation**

The bill, *recommended by the Committee on Legal Services*, reorganizes sunset review provisions in statute by removing repealed provisions and renumbering the remaining provisions for clarity. Additionally, the bill adds self-repealing provisions, set two years after the scheduled repeal dates. The bill further directs the revisor of statutes to harmonize, renumber, and relocate sunset provisions concurrently enacted by other legislation during the 2016 legislative session to conform with the numbering convention established by the bill.

**State Expenditures**

Workload in the Office of Legislative Legal Services will increase minimally from FY 2015-16 to FY 2016-17 to perform the editorial and drafting work under the bill. This workload is expected to be minimal and can be accomplished within existing appropriations. The bill will also result in fewer pages in the printed Colorado Revised Statutes for Titles 2 and 24, as well as shorter source notes for these sections.

**Effective Date**

The bill takes effect upon signature of the Governor, or upon becoming law without his signature.
