### A BILL FOR AN ACT

CONCERNING A PROHIBITION ON CONVERSION THERAPY BY A LICENSED

102 MENTAL HEALTH CARE PROVIDER.

### **Bill Summary**

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. The bill prohibits a licensed physician specializing in psychiatry or a licensed or registered mental health care provider from engaging in conversion therapy with a patient under 18 years of age. A licensee who engages in these efforts is subject to disciplinary action by the appropriate licensing board. "Conversion therapy" means efforts that seek to change an individual's sexual orientation, including efforts to change behaviors Reading Unamended March 7, 2017

or gender expressions or to eliminate or reduce sexual or romantic attraction or feelings toward individuals of the same sex.

8	CHANGE AN INDIVIDUAL'S SEXUAL ORIENTATION OR GENDER IDENTITY,
9	INCLUDING EFFORTS TO CHANGE BEHAVIORS OR GENDER EXPRESSIONS OR
10	TO ELIMINATE OR REDUCE SEXUAL OR ROMANTIC ATTRACTION OR
11	FEELINGS TOWARD INDIVIDUALS OF THE SAME SEX. THE TERM DOES NOT
12	INCLUDE:
13	(a) PSYCHOTHERAPIES THAT PROVIDE ACCEPTANCE, SUPPORT, AND
14	UNDERSTANDING FOR THE FACILITATION OF AN INDIVIDUAL'S COPING,

4	the introductory portion; and add (1.6) as follows:
5	<b>12-43-201. Definitions.</b> As used in this article ARTICLE 43, unless
6	the context otherwise requires:
7	(1.6) "CONVERSION THERAPY" MEANS ANY PRACTICE BY A
8	LICENSEE OR REGISTRANT THAT SEEKS TO CHANGE AN INDIVIDUAL'S
9	SEXUAL ORIENTATION OR GENDER IDENTITY, INCLUDING EFFORTS TO
10	CHANGE BEHAVIORS OR GENDER EXPRESSIONS OR TO ELIMINATE OR
11	REDUCE SEXUAL OR ROMANTIC ATTRACTION OR FEELINGS TOWARD
12	INDIVIDUALS OF THE SAME SEX. THE TERM DOES NOT INCLUDE:
13	(a) PSYCHOTHERAPIES THAT PROVIDE ACCEPTANCE, SUPPORT, AND

25	person licensed, registered, or certified under this article ARTICLE 43
26	violates this article ARTICLE 43 if the person:
27	(w) Has sold or fraudulently obtained or furnished a license,

5	(x) Has failed to respond, in the manner required by the board, to

10	SECTION 5. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act
11	takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the
12	ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August

takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August 9, 2017, if adjournment sine die is on May 10, 2017); except that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in November 2018 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.

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
