Under the existing tuition assistance program for students enrolled in career and technical education certificate programs (certificate programs), students enrolled in certificate programs may qualify for tuition assistance if they meet the income eligibility requirements for the federal Pell grant program but the certificate program does not meet the

Pell grant minimum credit hour requirements. Under the bill, the tuition assistance program is available to students who are enrolled in certificate programs that do not meet the minimum credit hour requirements for the federal Pell grant program and who meet an income eligibility standard set by the Colorado commission on higher education. The bill clarifies that tuition assistance means money a student may use to pay for tuition, fees, and course materials.

1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 23-3.3-1101, **amend**  
3 (1) as follows:

4 **23-3.3-1101. Career and technical education certificate**  
5 **programs - tuition assistance - funding - definitions.** (1) (a) The  
6 commission shall establish a tuition assistance program for students  
7 enrolled in QUALIFYING career and technical education certificate  
8 programs. ~~referred to in this section as "certificate programs"~~. Subject to  
9 available appropriations, the commission shall allocate ~~moneys~~ MONEY  
10 to community colleges, Colorado Mesa university, area technical  
11 colleges, and local district junior colleges to provide tuition assistance for  
12 students who ARE ENROLLED IN QUALIFYING CAREER AND TECHNICAL  
13 EDUCATION CERTIFICATE PROGRAMS AND meet the income eligibility  
14 requirements ~~for the federal Pell grant but do not qualify for the Pell grant~~

2           CERTIFICATE PROGRAM" MEANS A CAREER AND TECHNICAL EDUCATION  
3           CERTIFICATE PROGRAM THAT DOES NOT MEET THE MINIMUM CREDIT HOUR  
4           REQUIREMENTS FOR THE FEDERAL PELL GRANT PROGRAM.

5           (II) "TUITION ASSISTANCE" MEANS MONEY THAT A STUDENT MAY  
6           USE TO PAY FOR TUITION, FEES, AND COURSE MATERIALS.

7           **SECTION 2. Safety clause.** The general assembly hereby finds,  
8           determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate  
9           preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
