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# A BILL FOR AN ACT

101	CONCERNING THE NONSUBSTANTIVE RELOCATION OF LAWS RELATED

#### **Bill Summary**

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at http://leg.colorado.gov/.)

**Committee on Legal Services.** Current law directs the office of legislative legal services to study the organizational recodification of title 12 of the Colorado Revised Statutes, which relates to professions and





occupations. To implement the initial recommendations of the study:

Section 1 of the bill relocates article 44.5 of title 12, which imposes requirements and penalties pertaining to the sale or offering for sale of authentic Indian and other arts and crafts, to a new part 2 in article 15 of title 6 of the Colorado Revised Statutes, governing consumer and commercial affairs;
 Section 6 of the bill repeals the article in its previous location in title 12; and
 Sections 2 through 5 make conforming amendments.

1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:* 2 SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, add with amended and relocated provisions part 2 to article 15 of title 6 as follows: 3 4 PART 2 5 INDIAN ARTS AND CRAFT SALES 6 6-15-201. [Formerly 12-44.5-101] Short title. This article shall 7 be known and may be cited as THE SHORT TITLE OF THIS PART 2 IS the 8 "Indian Arts and Crafts Sales Act". 9 6-15-202. [Formerly 12-44.5-102] Legislative declaration. The 10 purpose of this article PART 2 is to protect the public from false 11 representation in the sale or offering for sale of authentic Indian and other 12 arts and crafts. 13 6-15-203. [Formerly 12-44.5-103] Definitions. As used in this 14 article PART 2, unless the context otherwise requires: 15 (1) "Authentic Indian arts and crafts" means any product which 16 THAT is handcrafted by Indian labor or workmanship and is not made 17 from synthetic or artificial materials. "Findings" means the smaller component parts of a 18 (2)19 handcrafted item, such as clasps, glass, silver, or synthetic beads, stamped 20 parts not used as a major part of a handcrafted item, leather backings,

binding materials, and other ingredient parts not a major part of a
 handcrafted item.

3 (3) "Handcrafted" means the production of a product wholly by
hand tools, with the exception of buffing or polishing and the findings
used upon such THE products.

6 (4) "Other arts and crafts" means any product which THAT is
7 represented as an Indian design or product but is not handcrafted by
8 Indian labor or workmanship or which THAT is made by machine or from
9 synthetic or artificial materials.

10 (5) "Imitation turquoise" means any artificial compound or 11 mineral manufactured or treated so as to closely approximate turquoise 12 in composition or color or any other mineral represented as turquoise 13 when in fact it is not.

(6) "Indian" means any person who is enrolled or is a lineal
descendent of one enrolled upon an enrollment listing of the bureau of
Indian affairs or upon the enrollment listing of a recognized Indian tribe
domiciled in the United States or a person recognized by any Indian tribe
as being Indian.

19 (7) "Indian tribe" means any Indian tribe, organized band, or
20 pueblo which THAT is domiciled in the United States.

(8) "Natural" means the status of a mineral component, used in the
preparation of authentic Indian arts and crafts, which THAT does not
include any chemical alteration or discoloration.

(9) "Plasticized" means the process through which natural
turquoise of a soft, porous nature is altered by impregnating it with acrylic
resin or any other substance of a similar nature to produce a change in
coloration of the turquoise and allow it to accept a polished finish.

(10) "Represented" means the presentation of a product in words,
 description, state of being, or symbols when said THE product is offered
 for sale, trade, exchange, or purchase.

4 (11) "Spin cast" means the casting of jewelry components, other
5 than findings, by means of centrifugal force.

6 (12) "Stabilized" means the chemical process through which
7 natural turquoise of a soft, porous nature is altered to produce a change
8 in the coloration of the natural mineral.

9 (13) "Treated" means any chemical process through which a 10 natural turquoise is altered to produce a change in coloration of the 11 natural mineral.

(14) "Turquoise" means a blue, green, greenish-blue, or sky-blue
mineral, containing phosphorus, aluminum, copper, and iron, used as a
gemstone in its cut and polished form.

(15) "Unnatural" means the status of any mineral compound or
substance which THAT is not natural or which THAT has been chemically
altered, including a stabilized, plasticized, or treated mineral and imitation
turquoise.

6-15-204. [Formerly 12-44.5-104] Inquiry as to producer.
(1) It is the duty of every person selling or offering for sale at retail
authentic Indian arts and crafts or other arts and crafts to the general
public to make due inquiry of their suppliers concerning the methods used
in producing such THE arts and crafts and to determine whether such THE
arts and crafts are in fact authentic.

(2) It is hereby made the duty of every person selling or offering
for sale at retail to the general public natural or unnatural turquoise to
make due inquiry of their suppliers concerning the source, grade, and

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1 quality of the turquoise for resale.

(3) If the supplier cannot authenticate to the seller the origin and
process of manufacture regarding the Indian arts and crafts to be sold or
traded to the seller, the seller shall not sell said THE arts and crafts to the
general public as authentic Indian arts and crafts.

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**6-15-205.** [Formerly 12-44.5-105] Unlawful acts. (1) A person shall not knowingly:

8 (a) Sell or offer for sale any products represented as authentic
9 Indian arts and crafts unless such THE products are in fact authentic
10 Indian arts and crafts;

(b) Sell or offer to sell any authentic Indian arts and crafts
purporting to be silver unless such THE products are made of coin silver
or sterling silver which THAT is not less than ninety-percent pure silver by
weight or unless said THE person provides a statement to the purchaser at
retail concerning the content of the silver used in such THE arts or crafts;

16 (c) Sell or offer to sell any authentic Indian arts and crafts that are 17 not separately displayed from other arts and crafts and the authentic 18 Indian arts and crafts are not clearly designated with a tag attached to 19 each product and containing the words "Authentic Indian" in letters not less than one-quarter inch high or, if the authentic Indian arts and crafts 20 21 can clearly be labeled by the use of a display card, then in lieu of tagging 22 each article the person may label the authentic Indian arts and crafts with 23 a printed display card in letters not less than one-half inch in height and 24 containing the words "Authentic Indian". The label or display card shall 25 be maintained with the related crafts in an area separate from other arts 26 and crafts so as to clearly designate the authentic Indian arts and crafts. 27 (d) Sell or offer to sell spin cast components of authentic Indian

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jewelry, other than findings, or use spin cast components in authentic
 Indian jewelry unless such THE jewelry is labeled as being so cast in its
 manufacture.

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**6-15-206.** [Formerly 12-44.5-106] Unfair trade practices. (1) A person shall not:

6 (a) Use a false or misleading statement, written or oral, or the lack 7 thereof, a visual description or the lack thereof, or any representation or 8 lack thereof made in connection with the sale or trade of Indian arts and 9 crafts in the regular course of trade or commerce with the intent to 10 deceive or mislead any person;

(b) Falsely represent turquoise being sold as having
characteristics, elements, or qualities it does not have;

13 (c) Falsely represent turquoise being sold as natural turquoise if
14 in fact it is in an unnatural state;

15 (d) Make a false or misleading statement of fact concerning the16 price or value for the purpose of selling or trading turquoise.

6-15-207. [Formerly 12-44.5-107] Violations - penalty. Any
person who knowingly violates any of the provisions of section
12-44.5-105 or 12-44.5-106 SECTION 6-15-205 OR 6-15-206 commits a
class 1 misdemeanor and shall be punished as provided in section
18-1.3-501. C.R.S.

6-15-208. [Formerly 12-44.5-108] Right of action - damages.
In addition to any judicial relief, any person who suffers financial injury
or damages by reason of anything forbidden in this article PART 2 may sue
in district court and may recover actual damages sustained by him OR HER
and the cost of suit, including reasonable attorney's ATTORNEY fees.

27 SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 6-15-101, amend the

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1 introductory portion as follows:

6-15-101. Definitions. As used in this article PART 1, unless the
context otherwise requires:

4 SECTION 3. In Colorado Revised Statutes, amend 6-15-103 as
5 follows:

6 **6-15-103. Penalties.** A violation by an art dealer of any of the 7 provisions of this article PART 1 shall render the art dealer liable for 8 damages to the artist in an amount equal to fifty dollars plus the actual 9 damages sustained by the artist, including incidental and consequential 10 damages. In such an action reasonable attorney fees and court costs shall 11 be paid to the prevailing party.

SECTION 4. In Colorado Revised Statutes, amend 6-15-104 as
 follows:

6-15-104. Applicability. (1) This article PART 1 shall not apply
to any contract or arrangement in existence prior to March 25, 1982, nor
to any extensions or renewals thereof; except that the parties to such THE
contract or arrangement may thereafter elect to be governed by the
provisions of this article PART 1.

(2) Any provision, whether oral or written, in or pertaining to the
placing of a work of fine art on consignment whereby any provision of
this article PART 1 is waived shall be deemed to be against public policy
and shall be void.

23 SECTION 5. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 4-2-326, amend (4)
24 as follows:

4-2-326. Sale on approval and sale or return - rights of
creditors. (4) The provisions of this section shall not apply to the
placement of works of fine art on consignment, which shall be governed

1 by the provisions of PART 1 OF article 15 of title 6. <del>C.R.S.</del>

2 SECTION 6. Repeal of relocated provisions in this act. In
3 Colorado Revised Statutes, repeal article 44.5 of title 12.

4 **SECTION 7.** Act subject to petition - effective date. This act takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the 5 6 ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August 7 9, 2017, if adjournment sine die is on May 10, 2017); except that, if a 8 referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the 9 state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act 10 within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect 11 unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in 12 November 2018 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the 13 official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
