A BILL FOR AN ACT CONCERNING CONFORMING COLORADO STATUTORY LANGUAGE RELATED TO DISABILITY TRUSTS TO THE FEDERAL "21ST

103 CENTURY CURES ACT".

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. The bill conforms Colorado statutory language relating to the creation of a disability trust to conform to the language established in the federal "21st Century Cures Act". Specifically, it clarifies that the individual who is the beneficiary of a disability trust can also be the person who establishes such trust.

1	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:
2	SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 15-14-412.8, amend
3	(2)(a) as follows:
4	15-14-412.8. Disability trusts - limitations. (2) A disability trust
5	is not valid for the purpose of establishing or maintaining a person's
6	resource eligibility for medical assistance unless the trust meets all of the
7	following criteria:
8	(a) The trust is funded by assets of an individual under age
9	sixty-five who is disabled as defined in 42 U.S.C. sec. 1382c (a)(3), as
10	amended, and which is established for the benefit of such individual by
11	THE INDIVIDUAL, the individual's parent, THE INDIVIDUAL'S grandparent,
12	THE INDIVIDUAL'S guardian, or by the court.
13	SECTION 2. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
14	determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
15	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
