## A BILL FOR AN ACT

## CONCERNING AN EXAMINATION BY THE TRANSPORTATION <br> LEGISLATION REVIEW COMMITTEE OF REPLACING STANDARD <br> LICENSE PLATES ISSUED TO MOTOR VEHICLES.

## Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. The bill requires the transportation legislation review committee to examine the costs, benefits, practicality, and effects of replacing standard-issue license plates for motor vehicles. The bill also requires the committee to examine the best way to implement a statewide license plate replacement.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:
SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 43-2-145, add (10) as follows:

43-2-145. Transportation legislation review - committee repeal. (10) (a) DURING THE 2017 INTERIM, BETWEEN THE FIRST REGULAR SESSION OF THE SEVENTY-FIRST GENERAL ASSEMBLY AND THE SECOND REGULAR SESSION OF THE SEVENTY-FIRST GENERAL ASSEMBLY, THE COMMITTEE SHALL EXAMINE THE BENEFITS, COSTS, PRACTICALITY, AND EFFECTS ON INTERESTED STAKEHOLDER GROUPS, INCLUDING MOTORISTS, OF IMPLEMENTING A STATEWIDE PROGRAM TO REPLACE STANDARD ISSUE LICENSE PLATES WITH A NEWLY DESIGNED LICENSE PLATE. AS PART OF ITS EXAMINATION, THE COMMITTEE SHALL SPECIFICALLY ADDRESS:
(I) THE POTENTIAL IMPROVEMENTS INHIGHWAY SAFETY THROUGH IMPROVED VISIBILITY FOR LAW ENFORCEMENT;
(II) THE POTENTIAL INCREASE IN EFFICIENCY IN COLLECTING TOLL ROAD FEES;
(III) THE POTENTIAL GENERATION OF NEW REVENUE THROUGH SUCH EFFECTS AS CURTAILING AND PREVENTING MOTOR VEHICLE FRAUD AND NONCOMPLIANCE WITH MOTOR VEHICLE REGISTRATION REQUIREMENTS;
(IV) THE POTENTIAL EFFECT ON INSURANCE COMPLIANCE AND INSURANCE RATES;
(V) The recommendations of the American Association of Motor Vehicle Administrators;
(VI) The effects of a replacement program on county CLERKS' LICENSE PLATE ISSUANCE RESPONSIBILITIES; AND
(VII) THE BEST WAY TO EFFECT A LICENSE PLATE REPLACEMENT, INCLUDING THE APPROPRIATE TIME OR EVENT TO REPLACE EACH MOTOR VEHICLE'S PLATES, SUCH AS UPON REGISTERING A MOTOR VEHICLE OR CHANGING OWNERSHIP OF A MOTOR VEHICLE, AND THE LENGTH OF TIME TO COMPLETE THE REPLACEMENT OF EVERY LICENSE PLATE.
(b) This subsection (10) IS Repealed, effective July 1, 2018.

SECTION 2. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August 9, 2017, if adjournment sine die is on May 10, 2017); except that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in November 2018 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
