Martinez departed this life on November 21, 2016, at the age of 73; and	
WHEREAS, Senator Martinez was born to Benito and Alfreida	
Martinez in Holly, Colorado, where he grew up with his nine siblings;

WHEREAS, Senator Martinez attended Lamar Junior College,	
then transferred to the University of Southern Colorado in Pueblo, where	
he earned a bachelor's degree in political science; later, he earned a	
master's degree in sociology from the University of Colorado-Boulder;

1 2 3	WHEREAS, Senator Martinez served Colorado as a legislator for 20 years, beginning with a term in the House of Representatives in 1981; and
4 5 6	WHEREAS, In total, Senator Martinez served House District 32, representing Adams and Denver counties, for four years and later Senate District 25, serving Adams County, for 16 years; and
7 8 9 10	WHEREAS, During his tenure, Senator Martinez held various leadership positions, including Senate Democratic caucus chairman, Senate assistant minority leader, and Chairman of the Joint Legislative Audit Committee; and
11 12	WHEREAS, Senator Martinez was committed to working on issues involving the elderly, veterans, children, and the homeless; and
13 14 15	WHEREAS, Senator Martinez was an effective legislator who, despite being in the minority party for two decades, was able to pass an average of three bills per year; and
16 17 18 19	WHEREAS, Senator Martinez was a leader for Colorado's Mexican-American community and founded the Mexican American State Legislative Policy Institute and the Colorado Association of Chicanos in Higher Education; and
20 21 22	WHEREAS, Senator Martinez is fondly remembered by his two sons; three grandchildren; six siblings; brother-in-law; and many nieces, nephews, cousins, extended family, and friends; now, therefore,
