Note: This bill was not enacted into law; therefore, the impacts identified in this analysis do not take effect.

Summary of Legislation

This bill prohibits a state agency from knowingly assisting an agency of another state or the federal government in arresting a Colorado citizen for an act that is a Colorado constitutional right or violating his or her Colorado constitutional rights. The bill defines a Colorado constitutional right as a right that has not been declared unconstitutional by a federal or Colorado appellate court.

State Expenditures

Beginning in the current year FY 2016-17, this bill increases state agency workload to determine if a request from the federal government or an agency of another state violates a Colorado citizen's constitutional rights. To the extent that such requests are determined to violate a Colorado citizen's constitutional rights, state agency workload may decrease from denying the request. This workload impact is expected to be minimal and will not require a change in appropriations for any state agency.

Effective Date

The bill was postponed indefinitely by the Senate Judiciary Committee on May 1, 2017.
