Summary of Legislation

Under current law, only hotel and restaurant, tavern, and lodging and entertainment liquor licensees or the licensee's registered manager may purchase alcohol beverages for the licensed premises. Under the bill, an employee or agent of the hotel and restaurant, tavern, or lodging and entertainment licensee may also purchase alcohol beverages for the licensed premises.

Background

Each licensed hotel and restaurant, tavern, and lodging and entertainment facility must have a registered manager who purchases alcohol beverages for that location only. The cost to register a manager with state and local licensing authorities is \$75. As of January 4, 2017, there were 5,098 hotel and restaurant licensees, 1,428 tavern licensees, and 23 lodging and entertainment facility licensees.

State Expenditures

In FY 2017-18 only, the bill minimally increases the workload in the Liquor Enforcement Division in the Department of Revenue to conduct rulemaking as a result of the bill. Any necessary changes are expected to be addressed during the regular rulemaking process, therefore, the workload can be accomplished within existing appropriations.

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Effective Date

The bill takes effect August 9, 2017, if the General Assembly adjourns on May 10, 2017, as scheduled, and no referendum petition is filed.
