**Summary of Legislation**

This bill repeals the Fallen Heroes Memorial Commission and the Fallen Heroes Memorials Construction Fund in the Department of Personnel and Administration (DPA), and requires the Capitol Building Advisory Committee to take on any remaining duties of the commission. The remaining duties of the commission will be performed in conjunction with the DPA and the Fallen Heroes Memorial Fund, Inc., which is a 501(c)(3) organization established to raise money for fallen heroes memorial construction.

**Background**

The Fallen Heroes Memorial Commission was created by Senate Bill 07-086 to erect memorials near the Colorado Veterans Monument in Lincoln Park in Denver that commemorates the lives of Coloradans who died during specific military conflicts. There is currently a \$0 fund balance in the construction fund.

**State Expenditures**

Beginning in FY 2017-18, transferring the remaining duties of the Fallen Heroes Memorial Commission, currently in DPA, will minimally increase the workload for the Capitol Building Advisory Committee in the Legislative Department, and eliminate the workload for the repealed Fallen Heroes Memorial Commission. The remaining workload is minimal, and does not require a change in appropriations. This work will continue until the executive director of DPA certifies that the appropriate memorials have been constructed.

**Effective Date**

The bill was signed into law by the Governor on March 30, 2017, and takes effect August 9, 2017, assuming no referendum petition is filed.
