Summary of Legislation

This bill continues the Colorado Health Service Corps Advisory Council indefinitely. The advisory council is scheduled to repeal on July 1, 2017.

Background

The Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment (CDPHE) operates the Colorado Health Service Corps Program, which provides educational loan repayment for medical professionals who agree to provide primary health care services in a federally designated health professional shortage area. Participating medical professionals serve in public or non-profit clinics in low-income or rural areas throughout the state. The Colorado Health Service Corps Advisory Council assists the program by reviewing program applications from health professionals and making recommendations. The advisory council has 13 members, appointed by the Governor, from a variety of health-related professions and organizations.

State Expenditures

By continuing the Colorado Health Service Corps Advisory Council, the bill increases cash fund expenditures in the CDPHE by \$300 per year beginning in FY 2017-18. These costs represent a continuation of the current expenses incurred by the CDPHE to provide lunch to advisory council members during their meetings. Members of the Colorado Health Service Corps Advisory Council serve without compensation or reimbursement of expenses. No change in appropriations is required to reflect this minimal continuation of costs in the CDPHE.

Effective Date

The bill was signed into law by the Governor and took effect on April 18, 2017.
