**Summary of Legislation**

Under current law, the authority to form local advisory boards for veteran community living centers is scheduled to repeal on July 1, 2017. This bill eliminates the repeal date, and continues the boards indefinitely.

**Background**

The State Board of Human Services, in conjunction with the Division of Veterans Community Living Centers in the Department of Human Services (DHS), promulgated rules that direct the creation and operation of local advisory boards at veterans community living centers. Each local advisory board ensures appropriate communication channels are in place between the community living center, the local community, and other stake holder groups to resolve any issues. Local advisory boards have been created in Aurora, Florence, Homelake, and Walsenberg.

**State Expenditures**

Continuation of the local advisory boards will minimally increase workload for veteran community living centers and the DHS to facilitate the boards' operation and receive reports from the local boards. This continuation of workload is minimal and no change in appropriations are required.

**Effective Date**

The bill was signed into law by the Governor and took effect on June 5, 2017.
