107	WITH JOB CREATION OR RETENTION.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. The bill authorizes the executive director of the department of local affairs (executive director) or the executive director's designee to coordinate the provision of nonmonetary resources to assist with job retention or creation in a rural community experiencing a significant economic event, such as a plant closure or layoffs, including industry-wide layoffs, that has a significant, quantifiable impact on jobs within that community.

The bill also authorizes the executive director or the executive director's designee to award money to qualifying rural communities experiencing a significant economic event and creates the rural economic advancement of Colorado towns fund (fund), to be administered by the executive director for grant-making purposes over the next 3 years. For the 2018-19, 2019-20, and 2020-21 state fiscal years, \$500,000 is transferred each year from the general fund to the fund and the money in the fund is continuously appropriated to the department of local affairs.

17	November 2018 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the
18	official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
