The bill authorizes the executive director of the department of local affairs (executive director) or the executive director's designee to coordinate the provision of nonmonetary resources to assist with job retention or creation in a rural community experiencing a significant economic event, such as a plant closure or layoffs, including industry-wide layoffs, that has a significant, quantifiable impact on jobs within that community.

The bill also authorizes the executive director or the executive director's designee to award money to qualifying rural communities experiencing a significant economic event and creates the rural economic advancement of Colorado towns fund (fund), to be administered by the executive director for grant-making purposes over the next 3 years. For the 2018-19, 2019-20, and 2020-21 state fiscal years, \$500,000 is transferred each year from the general fund to the fund and the money in the fund is continuously appropriated to the department of local affairs.

11	ASSEMBLY HEREBY FINDS AND DETERMINES THAT:
12	(a) CERTAIN SIGNIFICANT ECONOMIC EVENTS, SUCH AS PLANT
13	CLOSURES AND LAYOFFS, INCLUDING INDUSTRY-WIDE LAYOFFS, CAUSE
14	SUBSTANTIAL JOB LOSSES, WHICH CAN HAVE AN ESPECIALLY DETRIMENTAL
15	IMPACT WHEN SUCH JOB LOSSES OCCUR IN RURAL COMMUNITIES;
16	(b) THESE EVENTS MAY CREATE A SUDDEN NEED FOR INCREASED

SUCH AS A PLANT CLOSURE OR LAYOFFS, INCLUDING INDUSTRY-WIDE
LAYOFFS, THAT MAY HAVE A SIGNIFICANT, QUANTIFIABLE IMPACT ON THE
TOTAL NUMBER OF JOBS WITHIN THE RURAL COMMUNITY, AS DETERMINED
BY THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR WHEN CONSIDERING APPLICATIONS FOR
NONMONETARY ASSISTANCE PURSUANT TO SECTION 24-32-3604.

Rural economic advancement of Colorado towns 10 - coordination of nonmonetary assistance - application - rules. 11 (1) FOR THE PURPOSE OF ASSISTING RURAL COMMUNITIES WITH JOB 12 RETENTION AND CREATION, THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SHALL COORDINATE 13 THE PROVISION OF AVAILABLE STATE NONMONETARY RESOURCES AND 14 ASSISTANCE TO RURAL COMMUNITIES IMPACTED BY A SIGNIFICANT 15 ECONOMIC EVENT OR AN ANTICIPATED EVENT THAT HAS BEEN 16 ANNOUNCED. 4 (b) IF A PERSON APPLYING ON BEHALF OF A RURAL COMMUNITY 5 HAS SUFFICIENTLY DEMONSTRATED TO THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S 6 SATISFACTION THAT THE RURAL COMMUNITY QUALIFIES FOR ASSISTANCE 7 UNDER THIS SECTION. THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR SHALL COORDINATE THE 8 RESOURCES AND ASSISTANCE WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF LABOR AND 9 EMPLOYMENT CREATED IN SECTION 24-1-121, THE COLORADO OFFICE OF 10 ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT CREATED IN SECTION 24-48.5-101, AND THE 11 REGIONAL MANAGER OF THE REGION COVERING THE RURAL COMMUNITY 12 FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF LOCAL AFFAIRS CREATED IN SECTION 24-1-125. 13 THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR AND THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTORS OF THE 14 DEPARTMENT OF LABOR AND EMPLOYMENT AND THE COLORADO OFFICE 15 OF ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT SHALL EACH DETERMINE WHETHER SUCH 16 ASSISTANCE REQUIRES ANY STAFFING SUPPORT. 3 SECTION 2. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act 4 takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August 5 6 8, 2018, if adjournment sine die is on May 9, 2018); except that, if a 7 referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the 8 state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act 9 within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in 10 11 November 2018 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the 12 official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
