A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING ADDRESSING THE ISSUE OF YOUTH WHO ARE

102 EXPERIENCING HOMELESSNESS IN COLORADO.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at <u>http://leg.colorado.gov</u>.)

The bill establishes the task force concerning youth who are experiencing homelessness (task force) to study and make recommendations on issues related to the issue of youth experiencing homelessness in Colorado. The membership of the task force is set forth, as well as reporting requirements and a repeal date.

The bill makes conforming amendments to correct citations to an

earlier relocation of the office of homeless youth services to the department of local affairs.

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado: 2 SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, add 24-32-723.5 as 3 follows: 4 24-32-723.5. Task force 5concerning youth who are 5 experiencing homelessness - creation - membership - duties - report 6 - legislative declaration - definitions. (1) (a) THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY 7 FINDS AND DECLARES THAT: 8 (I) MORE THAN EIGHTY-THREE THOUSAND YOUTH BETWEEN THE 9 AGES OF FOURTEEN AND TWENTY-FOUR ARE HOMELESS IN THE UNITED 10 STATES; 11 (II) THE MOST VULNERABLE SEGMENT OF COLORADO'S 12 POPULATION, CHILDREN AND YOUTH, ARE EXPERIENCING HOMELESSNESS 13 AT AN INCREASING RATE; 14 (III) HOMELESSNESS HAS A SIGNIFICANT NEGATIVE IMPACT ON THE 15 WELL-BEING OF INDIVIDUALS, PARTICULARLY THOSE WHO EXPERIENCE IT 16 AT A YOUNG AGE; AND 17 (IV) UNACCOMPANIED CHILDREN AND YOUTH WHO EXPERIENCE 18 HOMELESSNESS EXPERIENCE SIGNIFICANT IMMEDIATE AND LONG-TERM 19 TRAUMA. 20 (b) THEREFORE, THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY DECLARES THAT IT IS IN 21 THE BEST INTERESTS OF THE STATE OF COLORADO TO ESTABLISH A TASK 22 FORCE TO EXAMINE COLORADO'S SYSTEM OF SERVICES AND CREATE AND 23 COORDINATE A STATE PLAN TO SUPPORT BETTER OUTCOMES FOR CHILDREN 24 AND YOUTH WHO ARE EXPERIENCING HOMELESSNESS. 25 (2) AS USED IN THIS SECTION, UNLESS THE CONTEXT OTHERWISE 1 REQUIRES:

2 (a) "TASK FORCE" MEANS THE TASK FORCE CONCERNING YOUTH
3 WHO ARE EXPERIENCING HOMELESSNESS CREATED IN SUBSECTION (3) OF
4 THIS SECTION.

5 (b) "Youth who is experiencing homelessness" means a
6 Youth who is at least eleven years of age but is less than
7 TWENTY-FIVE YEARS OF AGE AND:

8 (I) WHO LACKS A FIXED, REGULAR, AND ADEQUATE NIGHTTIME
9 RESIDENCE; OR

10 (II) WHO HAS A PRIMARY NIGHTTIME RESIDENCE THAT IS:

(A) A SUPERVISED, PUBLICLY OR PRIVATELY OPERATED SHELTER
DESIGNED TO PROVIDE TEMPORARY LIVING ACCOMMODATIONS, OTHER
THAN A PUBLICLY OR PRIVATELY OPERATED ACCOMMODATION THAT HAS
A PRIMARY PURPOSE OF DETAINING OR OTHERWISE IMPRISONING AN
INDIVIDUAL PURSUANT TO AN ACT OF CONGRESS OR A STATE LAW; OR

16 (B) A PUBLIC OR PRIVATE PLACE NOT DESIGNED FOR, NOR
17 ORDINARILY USED AS, A REGULAR SLEEPING ACCOMMODATION FOR
18 HUMAN BEINGS.

(3) THERE IS CREATED IN THE DEPARTMENT OF LOCAL AFFAIRS THE
TASK FORCE CONCERNING YOUTH WHO ARE EXPERIENCING HOMELESSNESS.
THE PURPOSE OF THE TASK FORCE IS TO EXAMINE COLORADO'S CURRENT
SYSTEM OF CARE AND SERVICES FOR YOUTH TO PREVENT AND END
HOMELESSNESS FOR YOUTH. THE TASK FORCE SHALL RECOMMEND
SOLUTIONS ON ISSUES INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO:

25 (a) WAYS TO INCREASE ACCESS TO SAFE SHELTER AND SERVICES
26 FOR YOUTH WHO ARE LESS THAN EIGHTEEN YEARS OF AGE;

27 (b) INCREASING COORDINATION BETWEEN EXISTING STATE

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DEPARTMENTS; THE CONTINUUM OF CARE PROGRAM AGENCIES, AS
 DEFINED IN THE FEDERAL "MCKINNEY-VENTO HOMELESS ASSISTANCE
 ACT OF 1987", AS AMENDED BY THE FEDERAL "HOMELESS EMERGENCY
 ASSISTANCE AND RAPID TRANSITION TO HOUSING (HEARTH) ACT OF
 2009", AND THE CONTINUUM OF CARE PROGRAM ESTABLISHED IN FEDERAL
 RULE 24 CFR 578.5(a); AND NONPROFIT ORGANIZATIONS PROVIDING
 SERVICES TO YOUTH WHO ARE EXPERIENCING HOMELESSNESS;

8 (c) WAYS TO INCREASE APPROPRIATE QUALITY HOUSING AND
9 OTHER SERVICES FOR YOUTH WHO ARE AT LEAST EIGHTEEN YEARS OF AGE
10 BUT LESS THAN TWENTY-FIVE YEARS OF AGE WHO ARE AT RISK OF OR
11 CURRENTLY EXPERIENCING HOMELESSNESS;

12 (d) ENSURING A STATEWIDE STRATEGY THAT PREVENTS AND ENDS
13 HOMELESSNESS; AND

14 (e) EVALUATING OUTCOMES AND REPORTING BACK ON
15 COLORADO'S PROGRESS TOWARD PREVENTING AND ENDING YOUTH
16 HOMELESSNESS.

17 (4) (a) THE TASK FORCE CONSISTS OF TWENTY-ONE MEMBERS,18 APPOINTED AS FOLLOWS:

(I) THE DIRECTOR OF THE DIVISION OF HOUSING IN THE
 DEPARTMENT OF LOCAL AFFAIRS, OR HIS OR HER DESIGNEE;

21 (II) THE ATTORNEY GENERAL, OR HIS OR HER DESIGNEE;

(III) THE DIRECTOR OF THE OFFICE OF ADULT AND JUVENILE
JUSTICE IN THE DIVISION OF CRIMINAL JUSTICE, AS APPOINTED BY THE
DIRECTOR OF THE DIVISION OF CRIMINAL JUSTICE, OR HIS OR HER
DESIGNEE;

26 (IV) THE DIRECTOR OF THE OFFICE OF CHILDREN, YOUTH, AND
27 FAMILIES IN THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES, OR HIS OR HER

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1 DESIGNEE;

2 (V) THE DIRECTOR OF THE OFFICE OF BEHAVIORAL HEALTH IN THE 3 DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES, OR HIS OR HER DESIGNEE; 4 (VI) THE COMMISSIONER OF EDUCATION, OR HIS OR HER DESIGNEE; 5 (VII) THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE DEPARTMENT OF LABOR 6 AND EMPLOYMENT, OR HIS OR HER DESIGNEE; 7 (VIII) THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH 8 CARE POLICY AND FINANCING, OR HIS OR HER DESIGNEE; AND 9 (IX) THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE OFFICE OF THE CHILD'S 10 REPRESENTATIVE, OR HIS OR HER DESIGNEE; 11 (X) TEN MEMBERS APPOINTED BY THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF 12 THE DEPARTMENT OF LOCAL AFFAIRS AS FOLLOWS: 13 (A) TWO YOUTH WHO HAVE EXPERIENCED HOMELESSNESS; 14 (B) THREE REPRESENTATIVES FROM LICENSED FACILITIES FOR 15 YOUTH WHO ARE EXPERIENCING HOMELESSNESS, WITH ONE 16 REPRESENTATIVE EACH FROM A RURAL, SUBURBAN, AND URBAN AREA; 17 (C) ONE REPRESENTATIVE FROM AN ORGANIZATION THAT SERVES 18 YOUTH WHO ARE YOUNGER THAN EIGHTEEN YEARS OF AGE AND 19 EXPERIENCING HOMELESSNESS; 20 (D) ONE REPRESENTATIVE FROM AN ORGANIZATION THAT SERVES 21 YOUTH WHO ARE AT LEAST EIGHTEEN YEARS OF AGE BUT YOUNGER THAN 22 TWENTY-FIVE YEARS OF AGE AND EXPERIENCING HOMELESSNESS; 23 (E) TWO REPRESENTATIVES FROM ONE OR MORE STATEWIDE 24 ORGANIZATIONS THAT ADVOCATE TO END YOUTH HOMELESSNESS; AND 25 (F) ONE REPRESENTATIVE FROM AN ADVOCACY GROUP FOR THE 26 LEGAL RIGHTS OF YOUTH; AND 27 (XI) TWO REPRESENTATIVES OF COUNTY DEPARTMENTS OF HUMAN

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OR SOCIAL SERVICES, ONE OF WHICH MUST REPRESENT AN URBAN COUNTY
 AND ONE OF WHICH MUST REPRESENT A RURAL COUNTY, EACH APPOINTED
 BY THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES.
 (b) THE MEMBERS OF THE TASK FORCE SHALL SERVE ON A

4 (b) THE MEMBERS OF THE TASK FORCE SHALL SERVE ON A
5 VOLUNTARY BASIS WITHOUT COMPENSATION.

6 (5) (a) THE TASK FORCE SHALL CONVENE ON OR BEFORE JULY 1,
7 2018, AND MEET A MINIMUM OF SIX TIMES PRIOR TO JUNE 30, 2020.

8 (b) THE TASK FORCE SHALL PREPARE A REPORT ON OR BEFORE 9 AUGUST 1, 2019, AND ANOTHER REPORT ON OR BEFORE AUGUST 1, 2020, 10 THAT INCLUDES RECOMMENDATIONS ON EACH OF THE ISSUES SET FORTH 11 IN SUBSECTION (3) OF THIS SECTION. THE TASK FORCE SHALL SUBMIT EACH 12 REPORT TO THE DEPARTMENT OF LOCAL AFFAIRS AND TO THE LOCAL 13 GOVERNMENT COMMITTEES OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES AND THE 14 SENATE, OR ANY SUCCESSOR COMMITTEES.

15 (6) THE DEPARTMENT OF LOCAL AFFAIRS SHALL STAFF THE TASK
16 FORCE USING EXISTING RESOURCES.

SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-1.9-102, amend
(1)(a) introductory portion, (1)(a)(VII), and (1)(a)(VIII); and add
(1)(a)(IX) as follows:

20 24-1.9-102. Memorandum of understanding - local-level 21 interagency oversight groups - individualized service and support 22 teams - coordination of services for children and families -23 requirements - waiver. (1) (a) Local representatives of each of the 24 agencies specified in this subsection (1)(a) and county departments of 25 HUMANOR social services may enter into memorandums of understanding 26 that are designed to promote a collaborative system of local-level 27 interagency oversight groups and individualized service and support

teams to coordinate and manage the provision of services to children and
families who would benefit from integrated multi-agency services. The
memorandums of understanding entered into pursuant to this subsection
(1) must be between interested county departments of HUMAN OR social
services and local representatives of each of the following agencies or
entities:

7 (VII) A designated managed service organization for the provision
8 of treatment services for alcohol and drug abuse OR SUBSTANCE USE
9 DISORDERS pursuant to section 27-80-107; C.R.S.; and

(VIII) A domestic abuse program as defined in section
26-7.5-102, C.R.S., if representation from such a program is available;
AND

13 (IX) A SERVICE PROVIDER FOR YOUTH WHO ARE EXPERIENCING
14 HOMELESSNESS, IF SUCH SERVICE PROVIDER EXISTS WITHIN THE COUNTY,
15 AND IF THE SERVICE PROVIDER'S PARTICIPATION IS RELEVANT TO THE
16 PROGRAM.

SECTION 3. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-1-120, amend (5)
introductory portion; and repeal (5)(i) as follows:

19 24-1-120. Department of human services - creation. (5) The
 20 department of human services shall include INCLUDES the following:

(i) The office of homeless youth services, created by article 5.9 of
 title 26, C.R.S. Said office and its powers, duties, and functions are
 transferred by a type 2 transfer to the department of human services.

SECTION 4. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-1-125, amend (2)
introductory portion; and add (2)(n) as follows:

26 24-1-125. Department of local affairs - creation. (2) The
 27 department of local affairs shall consist CONSISTS of the following

1 divisions:

2 (n) THE OFFICE OF HOMELESS YOUTH SERVICES, CREATED BY
3 SECTION 24-32-723. SUCH OFFICE AND ITS POWERS, DUTIES, AND
4 FUNCTIONS ARE TRANSFERRED BY A TYPE 2 TRANSFER TO THE
5 DEPARTMENT OF LOCAL AFFAIRS.

6 SECTION 5. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
7 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
8 preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
