A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING EXTENDING THE LENGTH OF PROSECUTION FELLOWSHIPS

102 FROM ONE YEAR TO EIGHTEEN MONTHS.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. Currently, there is a prosecution fellowship program that matches CU and DU law student graduates with rural district attorneys' offices. The fellowships last for one year. The bill extends the fellowships to 18 months.

Dashes through the words indicate deletions from existing statute. 1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

2 SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 23-19.3-102, amend
3 (1)(b) as follows:

4 23-19.3-102. Prosecution fellowship program - creation -5 committee - administration - conditions. (1) (b) The program will 6 match law school graduates for one-year EIGHTEEN-MONTH fellowships 7 with rural district attorneys' offices throughout Colorado. The initial 8 fellowships will be awarded in fiscal year 2015-16. The program may 9 fund the salary and benefits for up to six fellows each year. The fellows 10 are independent contractors and not employees of the Colorado district 11 attorneys' council. The program is limited to law school graduates from 12 the university of Colorado school of law and the university of Denver 13 Sturm college of law. Each law school shall contribute an equal amount 14 toward twenty percent of the cost of the fellowship salaries if the school 15 wants its students to be considered for the fellowship program.

SECTION 2. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
 preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
