CONCERNING CONTINUATION UNDER THE SUNSET LAW OF THE ENVIRONMENTAL MANAGEMENT SYSTEM PERMIT PROGRAM, AND, IN CONNECTION THEREWITH, IMPLEMENTING THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE SUNSET REPORT BY THE DEPARTMENT OF REGULATORY AGENCIES BY ALLOWING THE PROGRAM TO REPEAL.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-34-104, **repeal** (14)(a)(I) as follows:

24-34-104. General assembly review of regulatory agencies and functions for repeal, continuation, or reestablishment - legislative declaration - repeal. (14) (a) The following agencies, functions, or both, are scheduled for repeal on July 1, 2018:

(I) ~~The environmental management system permit program created in article 6.6 of title 25, C.R.S.;~~

SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, **amend** 25-6.6-106 as

follows:

25-6.6-106. Repeal of article. This article is repealed, effective July 1, 2018. ~~Prior to such repeal, the environmental management system permit program shall be reviewed as provided for in section 24-34-104, C.R.S.~~

SECTION 3. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds, determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
