

HOUSE BILL 18-1242

BY REPRESENTATIVE(S) Becker K. and Valdez, Rankin, Rosenthal; also SENATOR(S) Crowder and Baumgardner.

CONCERNING THE SALARY CATEGORIZATION OF LOCALLY ELECTED OFFICERS IN SPECIFIED COUNTIES.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 30-2-102, **amend** (1.5)(a)(III)(B), (1.5)(a)(III)(D), (1.5)(a)(IV)(C), (1.5)(a)(V)(B), (1.5)(a)(V)(D), and (1.5)(a)(VI); and **repeal** (1.5)(a)(IV)(D) as follows:

- **30-2-102.** Categorization of counties for fixing salaries of county officers salary amounts legislative declaration. (1.5) (a) For the purpose of establishing the salaries of county officers whose terms of office begin on or after January 1, 2016:
- (III) (B) Category III-B counties consist of the counties of Archuleta, Delta, Gilpin, GRAND, and Logan;
- (D) Category III-D counties consist of the counties of Grand, Las Animas and Montezuma.

Capital letters or bold & italic numbers indicate new material added to existing statutes; dashes through words indicate deletions from existing statutes and such material not part of act.

- (IV) (C) Category IV-C counties consist of the county COUNTIES of Huerfano AND RIO GRANDE;
 - (D) Category IV-D counties consist of the county of Rio Grande.
- (V) (B) Category V-B counties consist of the counties of Crowley, and Hinsdale, AND SAGUACHE;
- (D) Category V-D counties consist of the counties COUNTY of Cheyenne. and Saguache.
- (VI) (A) Category VI-B CATEGORY VI-C counties consist of the county COUNTIES of JACKSON AND Sedgwick;
- (B) Category VI-D counties consist of the counties of Jackson and COUNTY OF Kiowa.
- **SECTION 2.** Act subject to petition effective date. This act takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August 8, 2018, if adjournment sine die is on May 9, 2018); except that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect unless

approved by the people at the general election and, in such case, will take effect on the date the vote thereon by the governor.
