### A BILL FOR AN ACT

101	CONCERNING ADJUSTMENTS IN THE AMOUNT OF TOTAL PROGRAM
102	FUNDING FOR PUBLIC SCHOOLS FOR THE <b>2017-18</b> BUDGET YEAR,
103	AND, IN CONNECTION THEREWITH, MAKING AND REDUCING AN
104	APPROPRIATION.

### **Bill Summary**

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at http://leg.colorado.gov/.)

**Joint Budget Committee.** The general assembly recognizes that the actual funded pupil count and the actual at-risk pupil count for the

2017-18 school year are lower than anticipated when the appropriation amount was established during the 2017 legislative session. In addition, local property tax and specific ownership tax receipts are more than anticipated, increasing the local share of total program funding. The bill declares the general assembly's intent to maintain the average amount of funding distributed per pupil on a statewide basis at the level of the original appropriation, resulting in a reduction in the budget stabilization factor. The bill adjusts the minimum amount of total program funding specified in statute to reflect this intent.

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

**SECTION 1. Legislative declaration.** (1) The general assembly

3 finds and declares that:

4 (a) The actual funded pupil count and the actual at-risk pupil
5 count for the 2017-18 school year are lower than anticipated when the
6 appropriation was established during the 2017 regular legislative session
7 for total program funding for the 2017-18 budget year. As a result, total
8 program funding is \$12,917,463 less than the appropriation made during
9 the 2017 regular legislative session.

10 (b) In addition, based on the actual amount of the local property 11 tax and specific ownership tax receipts available to school districts for the 12 2017-18 budget year, the local share of total program funding is 13 \$96,900,446 higher than anticipated when the appropriation for total 14 program funding was established during the 2017 regular legislative 15 session; and

16 (c) It is the general assembly's intent to maintain the average 17 amount of funding distributed per pupil on a statewide basis at the level 18 of the original appropriation, resulting in a reduction of the budget 19 stabilization factor, and to adjust the minimum amount of total program 20 funding specified in statute to reflect this intent.

- 1 (2) Now, therefore, the general assembly finds it necessary to 2 revise total program funding for the 2017-18 budget year.
- 3 SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 22-54-104, amend 4 (5)(g)(I)(H) as follows:

5 22-54-104. District total program - definitions. (5) For 6 purposes of the formulas used in this section:

7 (g) (I) For the 2010-11 budget year and each budget year 8 thereafter, the general assembly determines that stabilization of the state 9 budget requires a reduction in the amount of the annual appropriation to 10 fund the state's share of total program funding for all districts and the 11 funding for institute charter schools. The department of education shall 12 implement the reduction in total program funding through the application 13 of a budget stabilization factor as provided in this subsection (5)(g)(I). 14 For the 2010-11 budget year and each budget year thereafter, the 15 department of education and the staff of the legislative council shall 16 determine, based on budget projections, the amount of such reduction to 17 ensure the following:

18 (H) That, for the 2017-18 budget year, the sum of the total 19 program funding for all districts, including the funding for institute 20 charter schools, after application of the budget stabilization factor, is not 21 less than six billion six hundred thirty-four million six hundred thousand 22 one hundred eighty-two dollars (\$6,634,600,182) SIX BILLION SIX 23 HUNDRED TWENTY-SEVEN MILLION SEVEN HUNDRED TWENTY-FOUR 24 THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED SIXTY-FIVE DOLLARS (\$6,627,724,965); except 25 that the department of education and the staff of the legislative council 26 shall make mid-year revisions to replace projections with actual figures, 27 including but not limited to actual pupil enrollment, assessed valuations,

1 and specific ownership tax revenue from the prior year, to determine any 2 necessary changes in the amount of the reduction to maintain a total 3 program funding amount for the applicable budget year that is consistent 4 with this subsection (5)(g)(I)(H). For the 2018-19 budget year, the 5 difference between calculated statewide total program funding and actual 6 statewide total program funding must not exceed the difference between 7 calculated statewide total program funding and actual statewide total 8 program funding for the 2017-18 budget year.

9 SECTION 3. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 22-54-114, add (7)
10 and (8) as follows:

22-54-114. State public school fund - repeal. (7) FOR THE
 2017-18 BUDGET YEAR, THE STATE TREASURER, BEFORE JUNE 30, 2018,
 SHALL TRANSFER FROM THE GENERAL FUND TO THE STATE PUBLIC SCHOOL
 FUND THIRTY MILLION SEVEN HUNDRED TWENTY-THREE THOUSAND SEVEN
 HUNDRED NINETY-ONE DOLLARS.

16 (8) THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY SHALL APPROPRIATE FROM THE
17 STATE PUBLIC SCHOOL FUND FOR PURPOSES OF SCHOOL SAFETY SEVEN
18 MILLION THIRTY-THREE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED EIGHTY-THREE
19 DOLLARS, WHICH AMOUNT RESULTS FROM THE REDUCTION IN DISTRICT
20 TOTAL PROGRAM FUNDING FOR THE 2017-18 BUDGET YEAR AS DESCRIBED
21 IN HOUSE BILL 18-1171.
