A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 **CONCERNING AN EXPANSION OF THE ABILITY TO LEAVE A MOTOR**
102 **VEHICLE UNATTENDED IN CERTAIN CIRCUMSTANCES.**

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. Currently, if a person's motor vehicle has a remote starter system and adequate security measures, he or she may leave the motor vehicle unattended while the engine is running. The bill provides that a motor vehicle may be left unattended if either a remote starter system or adequate security measures are in place.

1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 42-4-1206, **amend**
3 (3) as follows:

4 **42-4-1206. Unattended motor vehicle - definitions.** (3) The use
5 or operation of a remote starter system ~~and~~ OR adequate security measures
6 is sufficient to comply with subsection (1) of this section.

7 **SECTION 2. Safety clause.** The general assembly hereby finds,
8 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
9 preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
