HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 18-1014	
CONCERNING THE DECLARATION OF APRIL 9, 2018, THROUGH APRIL	
13, 2018, AS "HOLOCAUST AWARENESS WEEK".	
WHEREAS, Prejudice, bigotry, bias, and racism have been the cause of conflict, war, and mass atrocities throughout human history; and	
WHEREAS, The Holocaust was the systematic, bureaucratic, state-sponsored persecution and murder of Jews by the Nazi regime and its collaborators; and	
WHEREAS, The Nazis, who came to power in Germany in January 1933, asserted that Germans were racially superior and that Jews and others were inferior and an alien threat to the so-called German racial community; and	

3 in 4 B 5 a	WHEREAS, Hitler used anti-Semitism as a political weapon to gain popular support, blaming Jews for all of Germany's problems, including their defeat in World War I, the economic depression, and the Bolshevik threat of communism; it made little difference that Hitler's eccusations were blatantly contradictory and his facts were fabricated; and
9 li 10 a 11 in	WHEREAS, Between 1933 and 1945, Nazi Germany and its ollaborators murdered six million Jews (two out of every three Jews who ived throughout Europe), one-and-a-half million of whom were children, is well as five million other civilians, including Sinti, Roma, people with intellectual or developmental disabilities, gay men, Jehovah's Witnesses, soviet prisoners of war, and political dissidents; and
15 a	WHEREAS, We recall that in the aftermath of war, Israel, a hriving democracy and close ally and friend of the United States, became refuge for many survivors who endured the ravages of the Holocaust; and
19 e	WHEREAS, We gratefully acknowledge the over 26,500 non-Jews who, at great risk to themselves, saved Jews during the Holocaust from extermination and have been designated Righteous Among the Nations by Yad Vashem - the World Holocaust Remembrance Center; and
23 th 24 in	WHEREAS, Today, as we mourn the loss of those who were killed and consider the terrible experiences of those who suffered and lived brough the Holocaust, we note the dramatic rise in anti-Semitic incidents in this state and the country and the resurgence of anti-Semitism and Holocaust denial around the world; and
_	WHEREAS, We must also acknowledge that ethnic cleansing, genocide, terrorism, crimes against humanity, and wars on civilian opulations are not relics of the past; and
31 p	WHEREAS, Regretfully, the phrase "Never Again" has become Yet Again", as we see today and in the recent past so much brutality in blaces like Myanmar, Syria, Iraq, Nigeria, Bosnia, Cambodia, Rwanda, the Sudan, and the world's newest country, the South Sudan; and
	WHEREAS, Today, while we remember the Holocaust, we focus our attention on the passing of Holocaust survivors who provided first-hand accounts of the terrors they endured, leaving their children and

3	WHEREAS, While we are fortunate that several organizations in
4	Colorado are dedicated to retelling the stories of the Holocaust and other
5	genocides, it is not enough; far too many people, including most students,
6	need more opportunities to learn about these atrocities; and
7	WHEREAS, It is our responsibility to bear witness to the truth of
8	the horrors of the Holocaust and its many lessons; now, therefore,
9	Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the Seventy-first
10	General Assembly of the State of Colorado, the Senate concurring herein:
11	That we, the members of the General Assembly:
12	(1) Proclaim the week of April 9, 2018, through April 13, 2018,
13	as "Holocaust Awareness Week"; and
14	(2) Declare that the people of Colorado should use these days to
15	teach and remember the great injustices of the past and to commit to
16	preventing such atrocities in the future.
