- 94 Department of Public Health and Environment, Prevention Services Division, Chronic Disease Prevention Programs, Transfer to Health Disparities Program Fund -- It is the General Assembly's intent that if actual Amendment 35 revenue exceeds the appropriation, the transfer of 3.2 percent of such revenue to the Health Disparities Program Fund be increased to include 3.2% of the excess Amendment 35 revenue.
- 95 Department of Public Health and Environment, Prevention Services Division, Chronic Disease Prevention Programs, Chronic Disease and Cancer Prevention Grants --It is the General Assembly's intent that the General Fund in this line item go to a statewide not-for-profit organization to provide healthy eating program incentives among Colorado's low-income populations. As a part of the Department's responsibilities under section 25-20.5-104, C.R.S., such funds are to be used for improving access to fresh Colorado grown fruits and vegetables. This amount is calculated based on the assumption that the Department will minimize administrative expenses and use no more than \$10,000 for such purposes, and that the statewide not-for-profit organization use no portion of this appropriation for administrative expenses. It is the General Assembly's further intent that the statewide not-for-profit organization have experience in supporting healthy eating incentive programs, such as programs at local farmers markets, and experience with coordinating healthy eating programs and funding between local, state, and federal programs.
- 96 Department of Public Health and Environment, Prevention Services Division, Family and Community Health, Women's Health, Family Planning Program Administration; Family Planning Purchase of Services; and Family Planning Federal Grants -- Pursuant to Article V, Section 50, of the Colorado Constitution, no public funds shall be used by the State of Colorado, its agencies or political subdivisions to pay or otherwise reimburse, either directly or indirectly, any person, agency or facility for the performance of any induced abortion, provided however, that the General Assembly, by specific bill, may authorize and
