## **Summary of Legislation**

This bill amends the Colorado Food and Drug Act to require anyone selling meat at retail to the public to conspicuously display a placard next to the beef designating it as either "U.S.A. Beef" or "Imported," depending on where the animals were born, raised, and slaughtered. If imported, the placard must indicate the beef's country of origin. The bill exempts beef that has been manufactured, cured, smoked, cooked, or processed. The Department of Public Health and Environment may adopt rules to enforce the bill requirements.

### **State Expenditures**

Beginning in FY 2018-19, this bill increases workload by a minimal amount in the Department of Public Health and Environment to enforce the requirements of the bill and to promulgate rules if necessary. This workload can be accomplished within existing appropriations.

#### **Effective Date**

This bill was postponed indefinitely by the House Agriculture, Livestock and Natural Resources Committee on January 29, 2018.
