**Bill Topic:** UNCONSTITUTIONAL PART SEXUALLY EXPLICIT MATERIALS

**Summary of Fiscal Impact:** **No fiscal impact.** This bill would have repealed statutory language concerning sexually explicit material harmful to children that was declared unconstitutional by the Colorado Supreme Court. It would have had no fiscal impact for state or local government.

**Appropriation Summary:** No appropriation is required.

**Fiscal Note Status:** The fiscal note reflects the introduced bill, which was recommended by the Statutory Revision Committee. This bill was not enacted into law; therefore, the impacts identified in this analysis do not take effect.

## Summary of Legislation

This bill repeals statutory provisions concerning sexually explicit material harmful to children that were declared unconstitutional by the Colorado Supreme Court in 1985. It also makes conforming amendments.

## Assessment of No Fiscal Impact

While this bill repeals various class 2 misdemeanor offenses concerning sexually explicit materials harmful to minors, these provisions have not been enforced since the Colorado Supreme Court ruling in 1985. Therefore, the bill will not affect the revenue, expenditures, or workload for any state or local agency and is assessed as having no fiscal impact.

## Effective Date

The bill is deemed lost since the House of Representatives laid the bill over until May 9, 2018, during second reading on May 2, 2018.
