Description of Amendments in This Packet

J.001 Staff has prepared amendment **J.001** (attached) to add a provision appropriating a total of \$135,417 General Fund to the Department of Corrections' prison and parole costs for FY 2019-20 through FY 2022-23.

Points to Consider

This bill requires \$135,417 in statutory appropriations from the General Fund to the Department of Corrections from FY 2019-20 through FY 2022-23. These appropriations and transfers reduce the amount of General Fund available for other purposes.
