Current Appropriations Clause in Bill

The bill requires but does not contain an appropriation clause.

Description of Amendments in This Packet

J.001 Staff has prepared amendment **J.001** (attached) to add a provision appropriating:

- A total of \$125,356 cash funds to the Department of Regulatory Agencies for FY 2018-19. This provision also states that the appropriation is based on the assumption that the Department will require an additional 0.3 FTE.
- A total of \$19,917 reappropriated funds to the Department of Personnel from the amount appropriated to the Department of Regulatory Agencies. This provision also states that the appropriation is based on the assumption that the Department of Personnel will require an additional 0.2 FTE.
- A total of \$64,575 reappropriated funds to the Department of Law from the amount appropriated to the Department of Regulatory Agencies. This provision also states that the appropriation is based on the assumption that the Department of Law will require an additional 0.3 FTE.
