HEMP PRODUCTS DEEMED NOT ADULTERATED OR MISBRANDED **Bill Topic:** Summary of State Revenue (potential reduction) □ TABOR Refund □ State Expenditure □ Local Government **Fiscal Impact:** □ State Transfer □ Statutory Public Entity This bill establishes that food and cosmetics are not adulterated just because they contain industrial hemp. It also removes the term "cannabis" from the list of substances whose inclusion in a drug or device is deemed misbranded in the Colorado Food and Drug Act. It may create an ongoing reduction in state revenue. **Appropriation** No appropriation is required.

Fiscal Note Status:

The revised fiscal note reflects the reengrossed bill.

Summary of Legislation

This bill establishes that food and cosmetics are not adulterated just because they contain industrial hemp. It also removes the term "cannabis" from the list of substances whose inclusion in a drug or device is deemed misbranded in the Colorado Food and Drug Act.

State Revenue

The Colorado Food and Drug Act is identical to the federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act. This conformance makes the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment eligible to receive grant funding and contracts to conduct food safety inspections from the Food and Drug Administration. By creating a difference between the Colorado Food and Drug Act and the federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act, the bill may cause a reduction in grant funding and contracts.

Effective Date

The bill takes effect August 8, 2018, if the General Assembly adjourns on May 9, 2018, as scheduled, and no referendum petition is filed, and applies to conduct occurring on or after the applicable effective date.
