HOUSE BILL 18-1146

AN ACT**CONCERNING THE CONTINUATION UNDER THE SUNSET LAW OF THE MEASUREMENT STANDARDS LAW.**

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-34-104, **repeal** (14)(a)(III); and **add** (29)(a)(III) as follows:

24-34-104. General assembly review of regulatory agencies and functions for repeal, continuation, or reestablishment - legislative declaration - repeal. (14) (a) The following agencies, functions, or both, are scheduled for repeal on July 1, 2018:

(III) ~~The issuance of licenses and certificates related to measurement standards by the commissioner of the department of agriculture in accordance with article 14 of title 35, C.R.S.;~~

(29) (a) The following agencies, functions, or both, are scheduled for repeal on September 1, 2028:

(III) THE ISSUANCE OF LICENSES AND CERTIFICATES RELATED TO MEASUREMENT STANDARDS BY THE COMMISSIONER OF AGRICULTURE AND THE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE IN ACCORDANCE WITH ARTICLE 14 OF TITLE 35.

SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, **amend** 35-14-134 as follows:

35-14-134. Repeal of sections - review of functions. Sections 35-14-102 (3), 35-14-121 to 35-14-124.5, 35-14-127, 35-14-129, and 35-14-131 (5)(d), (5)(j), and (5)(m) are repealed, effective ~~July 1, 2018. Prior to such repeal~~ SEPTEMBER 1, 2028.

Capital letters or bold & italic numbers indicate new material added to existing statutes; dashes through words indicate deletions from existing statutes and such material not part of act.

BEFORE THE REPEAL, the licensing and certification functions of the department shall be reviewed as provided for in ARE SCHEDULED FOR REVIEW IN ACCORDANCE WITH section 24-34-104. C.R.S.

SECTION 3. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds, determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
