103	THEREWITH, MAKING AN APPROPRIATION.

## **Bill Summary**

The bill increases by one the number of district court judges in the first, eighth, tenth, thirteenth, seventeenth, eighteenth, and twenty-first judicial districts; by 2 in the fourth and nineteenth judicial districts; and by 4 in the second judicial district.
