**HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 19-1008**

101      **CONCERNING RECOGNITION OF AFRICAN-AMERICAN VETERANS.**

---

1            WHEREAS, The military history of African Americans spans from  
2 the arrival of the first enslaved Africans during the colonial history of the  
3 United States to the present day; and

4            WHEREAS, African Americans have participated in every war  
5 fought by or within the United States, including the Revolutionary War,  
6 the War of 1812, the Mexican-American War, the Civil War, the  
7 Spanish-American War, the Indian Wars, the World Wars, the Korean  
8 War, the Vietnam War, the Gulf War, and the wars in Afghanistan and  
9 Iraq; and

10            WHEREAS, Nearly 187,000 African-American soldiers served  
11 during the Civil War, roughly 350,000 African-American soldiers served  
12 during World War I, and another 2.5 million registered to serve during

1 World War II, with many more African Americans serving in the years  
2 since World War II; and

3 WHEREAS, On July 26, 1948, President Harry S. Truman signed  
4 Executive Order 9981, integrating the military and mandating equality of  
5 treatment and opportunity for African-American soldiers; and

6 WHEREAS, Desegregation of the military was not complete for  
7 several years, and all-African-American units persisted well into the  
8 Korean War; and

9 WHEREAS, The last all-African-American unit was not disbanded  
10 until 1954; and

11 WHEREAS, Until the Korean War, African-American veterans  
12 were precluded from direct access to benefits from the Veterans  
13 Administration, which included VA housing loans, employment  
14 assistance, unemployment benefits, and health care; and

15 WHEREAS, African Americans continue to serve in the United  
16 States military, providing exemplary service, duty, integrity, dedication,  
17 and commitment to our great nation; and

18 WHEREAS, Currently, 12% of the United States Armed Forces  
19 are African American; of those, the majority are African-American  
20 women; now, therefore,

21 *Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the*  
22 *Seventy-second General Assembly of the State of Colorado, the Senate*  
23 *concurring herein:*

24 That we, the General Assembly, in recognition of the heroic efforts  
25 and great sacrifice of African-American veterans, hereby encourage this  
26 commemoration throughout the House and Senate.

27 *Be It Further Resolved,* That copies of this Joint Resolution be sent  
28 to the Congressional Black Caucus; the National Black Caucus of State  
29 Legislators; the Retired Enlisted Association; the Tuskegee Airmen; the  
30 Colorado Black Women for Political Action; the National Association for  
31 Black Veterans, Inc.; the State Veterans of Foreign Wars; the State  
32 American Legion; the United Veterans Committee of Colorado; the State
