101	CONCERNING THE APPROVAL BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF
102	THE SPEAKER'S APPOINTMENT OF DEBRA JOHNSON TO THE
103	INDEPENDENT ETHICS COMMISSION.

WHEREAS, Section 5 (2)(a)(II) of article XXIX of the state
constitution provides that one member of the Independent Ethics
Commission created in section 5 (1) of that article, hereafter referred to
as the "Commission", shall be appointed by the House of Representatives,
and section 24-18.5-101 (2)(a), Colorado Revised Statutes, provides that
said appointment shall be made by the Speaker of the House of
Representatives with the approval of two-thirds of the members elected
to the House; and

- WHEREAS, Pursuant to such authority, Speaker KC Becker appoints Debra Johnson, a Democrat, to the Independent Ethics Commission to succeed Commissioner April Jones upon the conclusion of her term; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Ms. Johnson is the Denver Clerk and Recorder, serving her second consecutive four-year term in that elected position; 14 15 and

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1 2 3	WHEREAS, Prior to her election as the Denver Clerk and Recorder in 2011, Ms. Johnson was the appointed Aurora City Clerk for ten years; and
4	WHEREAS, During her tenure with the Denver Clerk and
5	Recorder's Office, Ms. Johnson was instrumental in instituting the mail
6	ballot delivery method as authorized by legislation enacted by the General
7 8	Assembly during the 2013 legislative session to ensure that all Coloradans have equal and easy access to the polls; and
9	WHEREAS, Ms. Johnson, seeking to ensure that all voters have
10	the opportunity to be well-informed, included "pro" and "con" sections on
11	each local question in the municipal Blue Book distributed by the Denver
12	Elections Division; and
13	WHEREAS, In 2017, Ms. Johnson's leadership and tireless efforts
14	to update and revise Denver's campaign finance laws resulted in a more
15	transparent election process with enhanced candidate accountability; and
16	WHEREAS, Ms. Johnson, in an effort to maximize citizen
17	participation in elections, fought to send ballots to inactive, failed-to-vote
18	voters, which position was ultimately upheld by the Denver District
19	Court; and
20	WHEREAS Ms. Johnson has publicly calculated doctor passion
20 21	WHEREAS, Ms. Johnson has publicly acknowledged her passion for public service, fair elections, and civil rights; and
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22	WHEREAS, Following nearly 20 years of honorable service as a
23	public servant overseeing municipal elections, Ms. Johnson has
24	announced her intent to retire from the Denver Clerk and Recorder's
25	Office this spring; and
26	WHEREAS, On the basis of her extraordinary service as a public
27	servant, her innovation and resolution of issues for the benefit of citizens,
28	her passion for fairness, her impressive experience and knowledge, and
29	her demonstrated integrity, Debra Johnson has demonstrated the
30	qualifications that will allow her to serve as a respected member of the
31	Independent Ethics Commission in an exemplary manner and to provide
32	leadership on matters of ethics in a way that will reflect well upon the
33	House of Representatives, the Colorado General Assembly, and the State
34	of Colorado: now therefore
