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**Bill Topic:** HOSPITAL TRANSPARENCY MEASURES TO ANALYZE EFFICACY

This bill directs the Department of Health Care Policy and Financing to create an annual report on uncompensated costs and expenditures made by hospitals using new information provided by hospitals to the department. Beginning in FY 2019-20, it will minimally increase state workload on an ongoing basis.

**Appropriation Summary:** No appropriation is required.

**Fiscal Note Status:** The fiscal note reflects the reengrossed bill.

**Summary of Legislation**

This bill directs the Department of Health Care Policy and Financing (HCPF) to work in consultation with the Colorado Healthcare Affordability and Sustainability Board to develop and prepare an annual report on uncompensated costs and categorical expenditures made by hospitals in the state (hospital expenditure report). In addition to using publicly available data, each hospital in the state is required to provide HCPF with certain information outlined in the bill, including financial statements, operating expenses, and staffing information. The hospital expenditure report must include but is not limited to a description of the methods of analysis, uncompensated care costs by payer group, and a breakdown of how different categories of expenses contribute to overall costs. HCPF must post the report to its website and submit it to the General Assembly, the Governor, and the Medical Services Board by January 15 of each year beginning in 2020.

The bill also requires HCPF, in consultation with the Department of Public Health and Environment (CDPHE) and the Division of Insurance (DOI), to determine whether the Hospital Report Card and the Hospital Charge Report that exist under current law require any structural or substantive changes. Recommendations to that effect must be submitted to the General Assembly by November 1, 2019.

## Background

The Colorado Healthcare Affordability and Sustainability Enterprise Board administers the Healthcare Affordability and Sustainability Fee. The Healthcare Affordability and Sustainability Fee allows the state to draw down federal matching funds under Medicaid to pay for uncompensated care at hospitals, as well as the costs of providing care to Medicaid expansion populations. The board receives an appropriation for its administration, which includes analytics and reporting.

## State Expenditures

Beginning in FY 2019-20, this bill will minimally increase workload in HCPF to collect information and to contribute to the report on uncompensated costs and expenditures made by hospitals in the state. As discussed above in the Background section, much of this information is already collected by the department; therefore, this workload increase can be accomplished within existing appropriations.

In addition, the bill requires HCPF, in consultation with CDPHE and DOI, to identify any structural or substantive changes to certain reports in FY 2019-20. This workload can be accomplished within existing appropriations.

## Effective Date

The bill takes effect August 2, 2019, if the General Assembly adjourns on May 3, 2019, as scheduled, and no referendum petition is filed.
