The bill allows the Colorado Municipal League to study the regulation of food trucks by local governments and report any recommendations to the General Assembly.

The bill may increase workload for local governments in FY 2019-20.

Appropriation Summary:

No appropriation is required.

Fiscal Note Status:

This fiscal note reflects the reengrossed bill.

Summary of Legislation

Under the bill, the Colorado Municipal League (CML) may study the regulation of food trucks by local governments and meet with stakeholders to solicit input and recommendations on or before November 1, 2019. CML may report to the General Assembly any findings, recommendations, or future legislative solutions. The bill is repealed September 1, 2020.

Local Government

The bill may increase workloads for the local governments that participate as stakeholders in the study with CML. Workload increases will vary based on jurisdiction and level of involvement.

Effective Date

The bill takes effect August 2, 2019, if the General Assembly adjourns on May 3, 2019, as scheduled, and no referendum petition is filed.
