This bill prohibits a local government from requiring a license or permit for a business that is operated by a minor on an occasional basis and is located a sufficient distance from a commercial entity. This bill reduces local government revenue and impacts workload by a minimal amount on an ongoing basis.

Appropriation Summary: No appropriation is required.

Fiscal Note Status: This fiscal note reflects the enacted bill.

Summary of Legislation

This bill prohibits a local government from requiring a license or permit for a business that is operated by a minor on an occasional basis and is located a sufficient distance from a commercial entity.

Local Government

Beginning in the current FY 2018-19, this bill decreases local government revenue and impacts workload. Local revenue is decreased if fewer business licenses or permits are applied for. Local law enforcement agency workload will decrease if they are not required to investigate claims of a minor operating a business without a license or permit. Conversely, if this bill increases the number of business operated by a minor, workload may increase to enforce local regulations such as health code regulations. Overall these impacts are assumed to be minimal.

Effective Date

This bill was signed into law by the Governor and took effect on April 1, 2019. It applies to minors' business operating on or after this effective date.
