Summary of Legislation

On July 1, 2019, the bill transfers \$30.0 million from the Unclaimed Property Trust Fund to the General Fund.

Background

Unclaimed Property Trust Fund. The Unclaimed Property Division of the Treasury Department holds lost or forgotten assets of individuals and businesses in Colorado. Assets are held by Treasury in perpetuity or until claimed. The Unclaimed Property Trust Fund consists of all moneys collected under the Unclaimed Property Act, and interest earned on the account. State law transfers an annual amount from this fund sufficient to fund the Adult Dental Fund in the Department of Health Care Policy and Financing. In the current FY 2018-19, the transfer is about \$17.4 million. The Unclaimed Property Trust Fund is TABOR-exempt; however, transfers out of the fund are generally subject to TABOR.

State Transfers

On July 1, 2019, the bill transfers \$30.0 million from the Unclaimed Property Trust Fund to the General Fund.

Effective Date

The bill was signed into law by the Governor and took effect on May 30, 2019.
