A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING DONATIONS OF FOOD TO NONPROFIT ORGANIZATIONS
102 FOR DISTRIBUTION TO NEEDY INDIVIDUALS.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. Current law provides limited immunity from civil and criminal liability to retail food establishments, nonprofit organizations, and other entities that donate items of food to nonprofit organizations for use or distribution in providing assistance to needy or poor persons. The bill extends the same immunity to correctional facilities.

The bill encourages retail food establishments and correctional

facilities to donate apparently wholesome food to local nonprofit organizations for distribution to needy or poor individuals.

1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, **add** 25-4-1615 as
3 follows:

4 **25-4-1615. Food donations to nonprofit organizations**
5 **encouraged.** EACH RETAIL FOOD ESTABLISHMENT IS ENCOURAGED TO
6 DONATE APPARENTLY WHOLESOME FOOD TO ONE OR MORE LOCAL
7 NONPROFIT ORGANIZATIONS FOR DISTRIBUTION TO NEEDY OR POOR
8 INDIVIDUALS.

9 **SECTION 2.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, **add** 17-20-129 as
10 follows:

11 **17-20-129. Food donations to nonprofit organizations**
12 **encouraged.** EACH CORRECTIONAL FACILITY IS ENCOURAGED TO DONATE
13 APPARENTLY WHOLESOME FOOD TO ONE OR MORE LOCAL NONPROFIT
14 ORGANIZATIONS FOR DISTRIBUTION TO NEEDY OR POOR INDIVIDUALS.

15 **SECTION 3.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 13-21-113, **amend**
16 (1) as follows:

17 **13-21-113. Donation of items of food - exemption from civil**
18 **and criminal liability - definitions.** (1) (a) No farmer, retail food
19 establishment, CORRECTIONAL FACILITY, or processor, distributor,
20 wholesaler, or retailer of food ~~who~~ THAT donates items of food to a
21 nonprofit organization for use or distribution in providing assistance to
22 needy or poor persons nor any nonprofit organization in receipt of such
23 gleaned or donated food who transfers ~~said~~ THE food to another nonprofit
24 organization for use or distribution in providing assistance to needy or
25 poor persons ~~shall be~~ IS liable for damages in any civil action or subject

1 to prosecution in any criminal proceeding resulting from the nature, age,
2 condition, or packaging of ~~such~~ THE donated foods; except that this
3 exemption ~~shall~~ DOES not apply to ~~the~~ willful, wanton, or reckless acts of
4 donors ~~which~~ THAT result in injury to recipients of ~~such~~ donated foods.

5 (b) ~~For the purposes of AS USED IN this section, "retail food~~
6 ~~establishment" shall have the same meaning as set forth in section~~
7 ~~25-4-1602 (14), C.R.S., and~~ UNLESS THE CONTEXT OTHERWISE REQUIRES:

8 (I) "CORRECTIONAL FACILITY" HAS THE MEANING SET FORTH IN
9 SECTION 17-1-102 (1.7).

10 (II) "Nonprofit organization" means any organization ~~which~~ THAT
11 is exempt from the income tax imposed under article 22 of title 39;
12 ~~C.R.S.~~; except that ~~the term~~ "nonprofit organization" does not include
13 organizations ~~which~~ THAT sell or offer to sell ~~such~~ donated items of food.

14 (III) "RETAIL FOOD ESTABLISHMENT" HAS THE MEANING SET
15 FORTH IN SECTION 25-4-1602 (14).

16 **SECTION 4. Act subject to petition - effective date.** This act
17 takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the
18 ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August
19 5, 2020, if adjournment sine die is on May 6, 2020); except that, if a
20 referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the
21 state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act
22 within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect
23 unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in
24 November 2020 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the
25 official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
